Number) Act, 1925, and by the Liverpool Corporation Act, 1927, and of every other power enabling Him in that behalf, doth by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and direct that:—

- 1. The number of Councillors of the said Croxteth Ward shall be increased from one to three.
- 2.—(1) The two additional Councillors of the said Ward shall be elected on the first day of November, 1929, and the election shall be conducted by the same persons and in the same manner as an ordinary election of Councillors of the City.

(2) The Councillor elected by the larger number of votes shall retire on the first day of November, 1932, and the other Councillor shall retire on the second day of November, 1931.

(3) The Councillor in office for the said Ward at the date of this Order shall retire on the first day of November, 1930.

- 3. The election of the additional Alderman made necessary by the increase in the number of Councillors of the City shall take place at the next ordinary election of Alderman of the City after the date of this Order and the additional Alderman so elected shall retire on the ordinary day of election of Alderman in the year 1935.
- 4. If for any reason it is doubtful which of the additional Councillors elected in pursuance of this Order ought to retire in the years specified in this Order, the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election by lot under the direction of the Lord Mayor or other person presiding at that meeting.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend George, Lord Bishop of Bristol, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, George, Lord Bishop of Bristol, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:

as follows:—
"There is in the County of Gloucester and Diocese of Bristol the Vicarage or Benefice of Henbury the Parish whereof contains a population of Three thousand or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for One thousand one hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Henbury is Seven hundred and forty pounds.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of Almonds-bury the Parish whereof contains a population of One thousand seven hundred and fifty-five or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for Four hundred and twenty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Almondsbury is Seven hundred and fourteen pounds

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Compton Greenfield the Parish whereof is delineated on the Plan annexed to the Scheme and thereon coloured Green and the said Parish of Compton Greenfield contains a population of Thirty-two or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for Ninety-six persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Compton Greenfield is Two hundred and forty-nine pounds six shillings and nine pence.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certain portions of the said Parish of Henbury containing a population of One hundred and seventy-five or thereabouts and distant from the Parish Church of Henbury three miles and more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured Pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield to which the said portions in the Parish of Henbury are contiguous.

"That it also appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the said Parish of Almondsbury containing a population of Three hundred and forty or thereabouts and more particularly delineated on the Plan annexed to the said Scheme and thereon coloured Blue may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Compton Greenfield to which it is contiguous.

"The Honourable Esmé Smyth, Colonel the Right Honourable Edward Murray, Baron Roundway, the Right Honourable Michael Guy Percival, Baron Middleton and Colonel Francis William George Gore are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Henbury and the Reverend John Collins Lloyd is the present Incumbent thereof.

"I, the said Lord Bishop, by virtue of my office am the Patron of the said Benefice of Almondsbury and the Reverend George Robert Wood is the present Incumbent thereof.

"I am also by virtue of my office the Patron of the said Benefice of Compton Greenfield and the Reverend Wilfrid James Crewe is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of the said Benefices of Henbury Almondsbury and Compton Greenfield and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme
