APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT Standings for Hackney Carriages at the following places, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

11th July, 1929 :—

<p>AT PORTMAN SQUARE, ST. MARYLEBONE.</p>	<p>Three Hackney Carriages: At the South-west corner of the garden enclosure, commencing at a point in line with the party wall of Nos. 32/33, Portman Square and extending North-westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for three carriages. Front of vehicles toward the South-east.</p>

15th July, 1929 :—

<p>AT WOODBERRY DOWN, STOKE NEWINGTON.</p> <p><i>In Two Portions.</i></p>	<p>Six Hackney Carriages: <i>First Portion.</i> Four carriages on the South side of roadway, commencing at a point four yards West of Tramway Standard No. 27, and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages, Front of vehicles toward the West. <i>Note.</i> Between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. SIX carriages will be permitted to stand on the First portion of this Standing. <i>Second Portion.</i> Two carriages on the North side of roadway, commencing at a point five yards East of the apex of the railings surrounding the Green of St. Olave's Parish Hall, and extending Eastward, by kerb, as far as necessary for two carriages. Front of vehicles toward the West. <i>Note.</i> Between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. the Second portion of this Standing will not be available. The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.</p>

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
