That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices of Hasfield and Tirley an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect or upon the cessation of the pension now payable to the Reverend Robert Stobbs Turner as aforesaid whichever shall the later happen a portion of the endowments or property of the United Benefice, namely a sum of £2,500 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock being part of a larger sum of such stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the said Benefice of Hasfield shall be severed and diverted from such Benefice and shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the Benefice of Ashleworth situate in the said Diocese of Gloucester.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

"1. That the said Benefice of Winterbourne Monkton, the said Benefice of Winterbourne Came with Winterbourne Farrington and the said Benefice of Whitcombe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Winterbourne Came with Winterbourne Monkton and Whitcombe' but

That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the two Benefices of Welwyn Garden City and Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene, both in the said Diocese of Saint Albans, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Welwyn Garden City, and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Welwyn Garden City and Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene, respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Welwyn Garden City and Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Welwyn Garden City and Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene, and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefices of Welwyn Garden City and Hatfield Hyde, Saint Mary Magdalene, or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Albans for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in any case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in

accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Albans has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint James, Oldham, and the said New Parish of Waterhead, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint James, Oldham and of the said New Parish of Waterhead, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Wollaston and Strixton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Peterborough and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Peterborough signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Bozeat with Strixton is now full, the Reverend Joseph Horace Marlow being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Wollaston is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Benefice of Wollaston and to the said United Benefice of Bozeat with Strixton now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, all in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, the said New Parish of Saint John, Moordown, and the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, the said New Parish of Saint John, Moordown, and the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas Helen Annie Reckitt of Number 21, Dean Park Road, Bournemouth, in the said County of Southampton, Widow, has contributed a sum of £6,110 Registered £4 10s. 0d. per centum Treasury Bonds and has transferred the same into our name to be held by us as and for a permanent endowment for the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed separate District and when such District shall have become a New Parish then of such New Parish:

"And whereas the said Helen Annie Reckitt has contributed a further sum of £5,090 Registered £4 10s. 0d. per centum Treasury Bonds and has transferred the same into our name to be held by us towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said sums of Treasury Bonds have been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Helen Annie Reckitt has nominated herself as the person to whom she desires that the first turn of the Patronage of the said proposed District shall be assigned, and the Community of the Resurrection at Mirfield, in the County of York, as the persons to whom she desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish after the exercise of the said first turn shall be assigned:

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, now Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, of the said New Parish of Saint John, Moordown, and of the

said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Francis, Bournemouth.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Helen Annie Reckitt, her heirs and assigns, for the first turn of presentation, and the Superior for the time being of the said Community of the Resurrection for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Francis, Bournemouth, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint John, Moordown, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, all in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Moordown, at the junction of Green Road with Ripon Road, and extending thence first northward then north eastward, then south eastward and then again north eastward along the middle of Ripon Road for a distance of 33½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Malvern Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Malvern Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hunt's Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Hunt's Lane (thereby crossing the road called West Way) for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Castle Lane, and with a roadway leading towards Muccleshell (upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Moordown, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst), and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Martin Hussingtree and Hindlip duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including an alteration of boundaries affecting the United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warn-don in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree is now full the Reverend Herbert Francis George Balcomb being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Hindlip is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Herbert Francis George Balcomb has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hindlip and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale as shall appear to us and to the Bishop of Worcester to be sufficient but not exceeding £1000 shall be applied towards the cost of improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and any residue of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England as a fund whereof the income shall be applicable towards supplementing the fund referred to in Clause 3 of this Scheme.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Hindlip having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Martin Hussingtree having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"6. That with the consents of Robert George Wilmot Berkeley of Spetchley Park, Worcester, Esquire (testified by his signing this Scheme), as one of the alternate Patrons of the United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon and of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ and the Blessed Mary the Virgin at Worcester (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), as the other alternate Patrons of the said United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon, and with the consent of the Reverend Lindsey Constantine Cooper (testified by his signing this Scheme), as Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Tibberton with Bredicot and Warndon upon the union taking

effect (a) a part of the detached portion of the said Parish of Warndon (situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Hindlip) namely so much of such detached portion as lies to the north of the middle of the Worcester and Birmingham Canal (which said part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Hindlip, (b) so much of the said Parish of Hindlip lying to the south of the said Worcester and Birmingham Canal as is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured green shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Warndon, and (c) so much of the said Parish of Hindlip lying to the south of the said Worcester and Birmingham Canal as is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured brown shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Tibberton with Bredicot.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said

Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department, by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise, to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps

in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission, the Department and a nominee of the Surveyors' Institution.

Until further notice, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from more active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post. Other things being equal and subject to this preference, preference will also be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, and among these preference will be given to such as have served or are serving in a Government Department over candidates without such service.

4. Candidates must be between the age of 25 and 30 years on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. In reckoning age for this purpose a candidate may deduct from his age time served in His Majesty's Forces between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

5. Candidates must have attained a satisfactory standard of general education and must have passed the Final Examination of the Surveyors' Institution, or the corresponding examination of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society. They must have had at least four years' professional experience which may have been obtained in:—

(a) The Office of a F.S.I., F.A.I., or member of the Land Agents' Society in professional practice, or in Government or Municipal Service; or

(b) The Office of any other Surveyor, Estate Agent or Land Agent which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate training.

Time which has been spent in study of Agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College if followed by the obtaining of a Degree or Diploma will be allowed to count up to two years out of the four years. Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to vacate their appointments on marriage.

6. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

7. No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from Service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department. Appointment will be subject to the condition that the person appointed may be required to serve in any town in Great Britain. Inland Revenue Valuers are not allowed to engage for profit in commercial dealings in land or houses whether directly or through an agent, or to accept any fee or reward whatsoever for professional or official services.

9. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces when called upon to do so the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate Education Authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF SHORTHAND-TYPIST AND CLERK-SHORTHAND-TYPIST IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered, prior to the first day of the examination and within three years of that day, one full year's approved service in a British Government Department, in one or more of the following posts:—Established Typist; Established Clerk-Typist; Temporary Shorthand-Typist; Temporary Clerk-Shorthand-Typist.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as established Typists for the purpose of these regulations although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. Candidates must be not less than 19 years of age on the first day of the examination; and candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, or the Metropolitan Police Office, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not be more than 40 years of age on the first day of the examination.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

No person will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject, and the daughter of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

and Llantwit Fardre commencing by a junction with the said work No. 1 at a point in Station Road opposite the south-west corner of the land numbered 847 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of Glamorgan (Ed. 1919) Sheet XXXVI. 7, and terminating in that road by a junction with the said Work No. 1 at a point 30 yards or thereabouts measured in a northerly direction from the centre of the bridge belonging to the Great Western Railway Company over the said Station Road.

(2) An aqueduct conduit line or lines of pipes (being a diversion in part of the said Work No. 1) situate wholly in the parish of St. Fagans in the rural district of Cardiff commencing in the road leading to St. Fagans Bridge over the River Ely by a junction with the said Work No. 1 at a point 120 yards or thereabouts measured in a north-easterly direction along the said road from the north-west corner of the enclosure numbered 239 on the said Ordnance Map, Sheet XLII. 12, and terminating by a junction with the said Work No. 1 in the road at the north-west corner of the land numbered 321 on the said Ordnance Map, Sheet XLII. 16:

(3) An aqueduct conduit line or lines of pipes commencing in the service reservoir authorised by Article 2 of the Barry Order, 1927, in or on the land numbered 61a on the said Ordnance Map, Sheet XLVI. 4, in the parish of Wenvoe in the rural district of Cardiff passing through the said parish of Wenvoe, the parish of St. Andrews Major, in the rural district of Cardiff, the urban district of Barry, and the parish of Porthkerry (Detached) in the rural district of Cardiff and terminating by a junction with the existing line of pipes of the Council at the crossing of the roads known as the Port Road and Pontypridd Road in the said parish of Porthkerry (Detached):

And whereas the Council have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Barry Order 1927, so as:—

(CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1929.
