"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Elizabeth Davis (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Avebury, now vested in her, the said Elizabeth Davis, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of July, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th

and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stanford Bishop situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Acton Beauchamp situate in the said County of Hereford and in the said Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stanford Bishop is vested in the Bishop of Hereford for the time being:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Acton Beauchamp is vested for an estate in fee simple in the Reverend Percy Ewart Warrington, of the Vicarage, Monkton Combe, in the County of Somerset, Clerk in Holy Orders:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Martin Linton, now Bishop of Hereford, and the said Percy Ewart Warrington, have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Stanford Bishop and Acton Beauchamp may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Percy Ewart Warrington (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stanford Bishop and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Percy Ewart Warrington, his heirs and assigns, for ever and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Acton Beauchamp and the Church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Percy Ewart Warrington and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at
