

frontage to the Mostyn Field line thence continuing in a north-westerly direction a river wall along this line for a distance of about 750 yards to a point opposite Mersey Road returning by an embankment at approximately right angles to the river wall and running in a north-westerly direction to high water mark at the westerly end of Mersey Road.

The material would consist of sandstone rock excavation.

Tipping would commence at an early date as soon as the necessary permission is given.

No portion of the works will extend riverwards beyond the approved Mostyn Field Line of frontage.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Regulations amending the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations.

And notice is hereby further given that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Amendment (Route No. 106A) (No. 2) Provisional Regulations, 1929, to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

These Regulations provide for the operation of certain additional omnibus journeys on Route No. 106 between Finsbury Park and Blackwall Tunnel.
