TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR A CERTAIN CLASS OF MALE WORKER IN THE TOY MANUFACTURING TRADE.

The Toy Manufacturing Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice Y.(10) dated 6th September, 1929, setting out Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by them and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour, to take effect as from 9th September, 1929, together with all Minimum Rates of Wages previously in operation which are unaffected by the present variation.
