And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report

to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women of 18 years of age and over in attending braid machines and winding machines at the works of Messrs. M.R. Limited, Shepshed, Loughborough, Leicestershire, on condition that subject to any arrangement specially made for the convenience of individual workers, no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks, and that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided.
