

House grounds; thence in a westerly direction along the road skirting the Wilderness Plantation on the north, and thence along the road in a northerly direction past the remains of the Roman Wall, taking the right-hand road past Buchley and continuing northerly along the road to the River Kelvin.

*In the county of Stirling.*

So much of the parishes of Baldernock, Campsie and Kilsyth as lies within, and generally to the south of, the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point on the Baldernock—Cadder parish boundary where the road from Buchley meets the River Kelvin; thence westerly and northerly along that river to the point where it is met by Branziet Burn; thence northerly along Branziet Burn to the point where it is crossed by the Kelvin Valley Line of the North British Railway; thence easterly along the railway to the point where it is crossed near Myrtle Bank by the road leading from Balmore to Glenorchard; thence northerly along the latter road via Myrtle Bank and Crossland, skirting the east side of the grounds of Glenorchard House, and continuing along the road via Mealybrae and Old Limekilns to the east of Peathill Wood, thence turning east along the road leading to Finniescroft Wood, and continuing along that road past the disused Campsie Alum Works to its junction with the Lennoxton—Kilsyth road at Glasert Bank; thence in a generally easterly direction along the last-mentioned road via Glorat Mill, Milton, Alton, Auchinreoch Mains, and Inchwood as far as its junction with the Gavell—Mollinton road at Queenzieburn; thence southerly along the last-mentioned road to the point where it crosses the River Kelvin at the county boundary.

**INCOME TAX.**

Whereas by Section 59 of the Income Tax Act, 1918, power is given for increasing, in certain cases, the number of persons appointed Commissioners for the General Purposes of the Income Tax and Inhabited House Duties and persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners in each Division in Great Britain; and it appearing to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue that the number of persons so appointed for the Division of Amesbury, in the County of Wiltshire, is insufficient for the proper discharge of the business therein arising under the aforesaid Act, the said Commissioners of Inland Revenue hereby authorise the increase in the number of the Commissioners for the said Division to any number not exceeding Fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding Fourteen; and We, the undersigned being two of the said Commissioners of Inland Revenue do hereby convene a meeting of the persons appointed for putting in execution within the said Division an Act passed in the 38th year of the

Reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for granting an aid to His Majesty by a Land Tax to be raised in Great Britain for the service of the year 1798," being respectively qualified to act as Commissioners in the execution of the last mentioned Act, to be holden at 12, Bridge Street, Salisbury, Wiltshire, on Tuesday, the 22nd day of October, 1929, at 12.30 o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of choosing and appointing, according to the regulations of the said Income Tax Act, 1918, such number of fit and proper persons to be Commissioners for General Purposes for the said Division of Amesbury, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners, as may be sufficient to increase the number of such Commissioners to any number not exceeding Fourteen, and of persons to supply vacancies amongst such Commissioners to any number not exceeding Fourteen.
