WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY (JOHN CALDWELL FERGUSON).

Whereas John Caldwell Fergusson, M.B.E., M.C., L.R.C.P.I., L.R.C.S.I., sometime resident at Lingdale, Cleveland, Yorkshire, and latterly at various addresses in Manchester, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said John Caldwell Fergusson cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said John Caldwell Fergusson, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said John Caldwell Fergusson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
