The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 21st instant, to nominate the Venerable Hugh Maudslay Horder, M.A., Archdeacon of Lewes and Prebendary of Heathfield in the Cathedral Church of Chichester, to be Bishop Suffragan of Lewes in the Diocese of Chichester.

The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in making ignition coils for Ford motor

tractors at the works of Messrs. A. Rist (1927) Limited, Freemantle Road, Lowestoft, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.
