NATIONAL DEBT AND LOCAL LOANS ACT, 1887.

(50 AND 51 VICT. C. 16.)

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury give notice that pursuant to Section 13 (5) of the National Debt and Local Loans Act, 1887, they have directed the creation of £5,355,200 Local Loans Three per cent. Stock, which Stock has been issued to the National Debt Commissioners.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 1st

November, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 4th November, 1929, to Saturday, the 9th November, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of

the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY (JOSEPH RANDOLPH MORELL MACKENZIE).

Whereas Joseph Randolph Morell Mackenzie, M.C., M.B., B.Ch., formerly of Queen's University, Belfast, lately residing at the Swan Hotel, New Street, Birmingham, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Joseph Randolph Morell Mackenzie cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Joseph Randolph Morell Mackenzie, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Joseph Randolph Morell Mackenzie to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

(f) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(g) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Saturday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.
