**LAW REGULATING THE COMMISSION  
TO ADJUST THE PUBLIC INTERNAL  
DEBT PUBLISHED IN THE OFFICIAL  
GAZETTE OF 22ND MAY, 1929.**

EMILIO PORTES GIL, Provisional President of the United Mexican States, to the inhabitants of Mexico:

By reason of the powers conferred on me by the Congress of the Union in the Law of January 25th, 1929, I promulgate the following regulating law:—

*I. Of the Commission and its competence.*

ARTICLE 1.—The Commission created by the Law of January 25th, 1929, will be called the "Commission to adjust the Public Internal Debt" and will have an office consisting of three sections: Judgment Section, Accounts Section and Administrative Section.

ARTICLE 2.—The Commission will be competent to take cognizance of all internal obligations of the Federal Government law-

fully existing up to December 31st, 1928, with the exception of the following:—

(i) Those represented by internal emissions included in and derived from the agreements of June 16th, 1922, and October 23rd, 1925, and the obligations derived from the same emissions.

(ii) The 3 per cent. bonds in liquidation of salaries of Federal employees.

(iii) Those obligations contracted in a budget allocation but not paid for in the corresponding fiscal period. For the purposes of the regulating law, the term "budget allocation" is to be defined as the liquid quantity intended for the heading for which the obligation in question has been legally contracted, taking into account the original allocation of the estimate of expenditure and any additions or reductions which may have been made in connection therewith.

(iv) Participations in taxes, duties and collections which the Federal Government may impose.

(v) Revenues irregularly collected.

(vi) Payments in advance on account of taxation and bank loans for short terms.

(vii) The Public Agrarian Debt created by the Law of January 10th, 1920, and all indemnities resulting from the Agrarian Laws.

(viii) The Bank Debt, when it is fixed in amount by agreement with the Federal Government.

(ix) Obligations derived from contracts for works of irrigation in process.

(x) Obligations derived from the contract of September 10th, 1925.

(xi) Obligations in regard to which Mixed Claims Commissions may decide or may have decided in accordance with the respective international conventions.

(xii) The credits already classified, meaning by this all those whose total may have been fixed and recognized in favour of a specific person up to December 31st, 1928, by authority which, in conformity with the law, may have been able definitely to establish obligations against the Federal Government.

ARTICLE 3.—Always provided that they are not included in the exceptions mentioned in the preceding article, the obligations lawfully existing up to December 31st 1928, to the charge of the Federal Government shall be within the competence of the Commission, according to the following categories:—

(i) Personal services.

(ii) Services rendered by enterprises, individual or collective, in conformity with "a reduced quota."

(iii) Services rendered by enterprises, individual or collective, in conformity with "a normal quota."

(iv) Contracts for works including supplying of material.

(v) Contracts of purchase or sale.

(vi) Contracts of lease.

(vii) Contracts of exchange, including money orders referred to in the decree of February 29th, 1928.

(viii) Contracts of loan.

(ix) Contracts of surety.

(x) Subventions which may not have been paid and which are legally in order.

(xi) Unfalsifiable paper.

(xii) Subscriptions of private individuals for the foundation of the "Banco Unico", according to the decree of September 21st, 1917.

(xiii) Acts which, in conformity with the law, lay on the Federal Government the obligation to indemnify direct losses caused thereby.

(xiv) Any other obligation not included in the above-mentioned categories but which could be included within the competence of the Commission in conformity with Article 2.

### 2. Of the Prescriptions.

ARTICLE 4.—The credits included in the preceding article shall be prescribed for within six months counting from the date of the publication of this Regulating Law in the Official Gazette of the Federation.

ARTICLE 5.—The prescription referred to in the preceding article may be interrupted:

(i) By action before the competent Tribunals.

(ii) By the fact of the submission of the credit for its identification to the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt in conformity with this Regulating Law.

(iii) In the case of credits already presented to Claims Commissions or other competent authorities by the simple continuation of the transactions before this Commission in accordance with the regulations of this law.

ARTICLE 6.—Every credit or claim which should be considered as having lapsed or having been prescribed in accordance with previous legislation, shall be rejected.

### 3. Of Procedure before the Commission.

ARTICLE 7.—In order to submit to the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt the credits mentioned in Article 3, interested parties shall have a period of six months counting from the date of the publication of this Regulating Law in the Official Gazette of the Federation and shall comply with the following formalities:

(i) Application shall be made in writing and in Spanish, showing with all clearness the nature and amount of the credit. If this credit is composed of the various categories mentioned in Article 3, each category and its respective amount shall be shown in separate sections.

(ii) The necessary vouchers in support of the category and the amounts claimed shall be attached.

(iii) The name and status as well as nationality and domicile of the claimants shall be given.

(iv) He who presents a credit in the name of another shall prove his identity by the usual legal methods; nevertheless, attorneys may prove their identity with a Power of

Attorney whatever may be the amount claimed. If this Power of Attorney extends beyond the Federal District, it shall be signed or ratified by the giver before the "Presidente Municipal" of the place of grant.

ARTICLE 8.—With regard to the credits mentioned in Article 3 which are or may have been left pending for decision by the competent authorities or by Claims Commissions, the interested party shall, within a period of six months counting from the date of the publication of this Regulating Law in the Official Gazette, present a communication in continuance of his action to the Adjusting Commission of the Public Internal Debt in which he shall declare his actual domicile. In this case, the regulations of sub-section iv of the preceding article shall apply.

ARTICLE 9.—The Commission, through its offices, shall send to interested parties a formal acknowledgment of having received their application or communication by means of which their action is being continued. This acknowledgment shall indicate date of receipt, number of application or communication and number of folios of which any annexes may consist.

ARTICLE 10.—The office shall pass on the papers to the Judgment Section for study in order that a decision may be reached. The office shall indicate whether it is one of the cases within the cognizance of the Commission in accordance with this Regulating Law, whether the obligation is prescribed or lapsed, whether the facts adduced as basic facts are sufficiently proved and, in this eventuality, whether the claim is wholly or partly in conformity with the law.

ARTICLE 11.—Having reached a decision in conformity with the preceding article, the papers in the case shall be shown to the interested party within the office in order that he may be able to make, in writing, any comments on this decision. For this, he shall have a period of fifteen days, counting from the date of notification.

ARTICLE 12.—If the interested party, within the period mentioned in the preceding article, desires to bring up fresh evidence, he shall be given once and for all a period not exceeding ninety days and not less than fifteen days to produce this evidence.

ARTICLE 13.—Interested parties may produce every kind of evidence, but the Commission shall always receive it in documentary form and, in case of declarations of witnesses or experts' opinions, these should be made through voluntary legal channels before the competent judges and certified copies of the proceedings sent to the Commission. Information by witnesses shall be made in the presence of the Public Minister or his substitute in the place where it is rendered.

ARTICLE 14.—The Commission shall be entitled at all times to make any investigations it may consider fit.

ARTICLE 15.—When the pleas have been drawn up, the new evidence rendered, or when the time limits for this purpose have expired,

the papers shall be returned to the Judgment Section for ratification or rectification of judgment.

ARTICLE 16.—When judgment has been ratified or rectified by the competent section, the papers shall be submitted to the Adjustment Commission of the Public Internal Debt which, acting in plenum and with a quorum of at least three members, shall finally decide and note the resolution in a special book for the purpose. All the members of the Commission shall sign the resolutions, and in case of difference of opinion note shall be taken of the dissent. In case of a tie, the President of the Commission shall have a casting vote. The resolutions shall have the force of a legal judgment.

ARTICLE 17.—All resolutions which may be made shall be communicated to the interested party in writing, and a copy shall also be sent to the Accounts Section in order that the latter may note in their registers the nature of the credit.

#### 4. General Dispositions.

ARTICLE 18.—Once action has been taken before the Adjusting Commission in conformity with Articles 7 and 8 of this law, it is thereby understood that the right of taking legal proceedings before the courts is waived.

ARTICLE 19.—For the purposes of sub-section iii of Article 2 of this Regulating Law, interested parties shall attend at the Ministry of Finance. The Ministry shall declare, having first taken steps to obtain the necessary information from the Department of Control, whether there is any balance of the credit in question. If the Ministry of Finance declares that there is no balance, interested parties shall validate their credits in accordance with the precepts of this law.

ARTICLE 20.—With regard to credits classified by other authorities and which also should be included in the account of the Public Internal Debt, the Ministry of Finance shall submit all information and proofs at its disposal in order that the office of the Commission may classify them and incorporate them in the respective registers.

ARTICLE 21.—The member of the Commission duly authorized shall sign for the Commission, and may delegate this power to the head of the office whenever he thinks fit.

ARTICLE 22.—Notification shall be made by official communication addressed to the interested parties either directly or through the Federal Treasury offices which shall be bound to transmit to the Commission an original certificate of having done so. In the discretion of the Commission, telegraphic methods shall be used for notifications.

ARTICLE 23.—All persons who may have a credit awaiting decision by the Commission, shall indicate an address within the Republic for the receipt of notifications. If this is not done, the certificate of decision or resolution shall be considered as due notification.

ARTICLE 24.—In order to hear notifications and to make the pleas referred to in Article 11, it will be sufficient if the interested party

authorized by telegraph the person who should do so in his place.

ARTICLE 25.—The Federal authorities shall be obliged to submit to the Commission every kind of data and to render it every necessary assistance for the better accomplishment of its duties.

ARTICLE 26.—The Commission is authorized to make regulations by means of general instructions for the internal economy of its office, to amend these regulations when necessary, to fix the emoluments both of the head of the office and of the other employees, who shall be appointed and removed on the proposal of the Commission to the Minister of Finance, . . . .

## ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 26TH OCTOBER, 1929.)

## FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 31).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Further Contraction of Chardstock (Devon) Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.*

1.—(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 28) as amended by the Order of the Minister (No. 4771), dated the 19th October, 1929, and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 29), shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine.

*Release of Infected Area from Restrictions.*

Provided always that if at any time lands,

tithes or other hereditaments sufficient in our opinion to produce the said yearly sum or stipend, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the Benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend or for such part thereof our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine. Provided also that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule. Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as one single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

Office, Carlisle intend to apply to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order"), under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, for all or some of the following, amongst other, purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Carlisle Corporation Electric Lighting Order, 1895, by adding thereto:—

- (a) the Rural District of Brampton;
- (b) the Rural District of Longtown; and
- (c) so much of the Rural District of Carlisle as lies beyond a distance of two miles from the Cathedral in the City of Carlisle; all in the County of Cumberland.

The areas so proposed to be added to the said area of supply are hereinafter referred to as "the added area."

2. To authorise the Corporation to generate and supply electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, within the added area.

3. To extend and make applicable to the added area all or some of the provisions contained in the Carlisle Corporation Electric Lighting Order 1895, the Carlisle Corporation Electric Lighting (Extension) Order 1911, the Carlisle Corporation Act 1904, and the Carlisle (Extension) Order 1912, and to apply such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein, and to repeal or amend so far as may be expedient any orders made by the Electricity Commissioners, under the provisions of Section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act, 1909, in relation to the supply of electricity by the Corporation to any premises within the added area.

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, as are applicable to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order, with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads, and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains, and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the added area, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew and remove, either above or underground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit, or distribute electricity within the added area, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added area and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in the added area.

7. To authorise the Corporation to open and break up in the added area streets and parts



of streets which are not repairable by the local authority, and also railways and tramways.

8. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1928, and the enactments incorporated therewith, and to alter, vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order, and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.
