ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST OCTOBER, 1929.)

FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE (IN-FECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 33).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Kent Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1929 (No. 30) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement and Short Title.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 33).
