Additional Rule for the Disposal of Documents which are not considered of sufficient Public Value to justify their Preservation in the Public Record Office.

I, the Right Honourable Ernest, Baron Hanworth, Master of the Rolls, in the exercise of 65-33552

the powers conferred upon me by the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1877, and the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1898, do, with the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby add to the 13th Rule of the Rules made by the Right Honourable William, Baron Esher, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 30th day of June, 1890, as amended by the Rule made by the Right Honourable Sir Herbert Hardy Cozens-Hardy, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 4th day of June, 1908, by inserting after the words, "any of His Majesty's Colonies", the words "or in the case of income accounts of Trustees by Transfer or return thereof to such Trustees or their successors." 19 March, 1929.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of May, 1884, Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, in exercise of the power given to Her by an Act of the Legislature of the Island of Jamaica passed in a Session holden in the 29th year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to amend an Act passed in the present Session entitled, An Act to alter and amend the Political Constitution of this Island," and by an Act of Parliament passed in the same year of Her Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to make provision for the Government of Jamaica," constituted a Legislative Council for Jamaica:

And whereas by the said Order Her Majesty reserved to Herself, Her heirs and successors, power, with the advice of Her or their Privy Council, to revoke, alter, or amend the said Order as to Her or them should seem fit:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the eleventh clause of the said Order:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers given to His Majesty by the said Acts, and of the powers reserved to His Majesty by the said Order, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. The said Order in Council of the nineteenth day of May, 1884, is hereby amended by the insertion at the end of the first paragraph of the eleventh clause thereof of the following proviso:—

"Provided that the performance of the duties of any office of emolument under the Crown or under the Government of Jamaica, in the absence or incapacity of the substantive holder thereof, but without receipt of any pay therefor, shall not be, and shall be deemed never to have been, the acceptance of such office within the meaning of this clause."

- 2. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Jamaica Gazette.
- 3. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors, power, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, to revoke alter or amend this Order as to Him or them shall seem fit.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd November, 1929, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th November, 1929, to Saturday,

the 30th November, 1929, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

### MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-section 4, of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

- 1. (a) Motor cars, motor vans, motor lorries, motor trucks and other motor vehicles (not including cycles) for use on highways as well as chassis and bodies therefor.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby givenotice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :-

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE: EXAMINATIONS FOR THE EXECUTIVE GROUP OF SITUATIONS, THAT IS TO SAY, FOR THE GENERAL. EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE, FOR EXECUTIVE BRANCHES OF THE DEFENCE DEPART-MENTS, AND FOR THE SITUATIONS OF ASSISTANT AUDITOR IN THE EXCHEQUER AND AUDIT DEPARTMENT, ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE ESTATE DUTY OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, ACTUARIAL ASSISTANT IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT ACTUARY AND ASSISTANT INSPECTOR ON THE OUTDOOR STAFF OF THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

With the exception of posts in executive branches in the Defence Departments, for which men only are eligible, competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women.

These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 18 and must not have attained the age of 19 on the first day of March in the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

- (a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.
- (b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.
- 2. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the children of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made—
  - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
  - (b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.
  - (c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.
