# FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1929 (No. 36).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

# Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

## Provision for Removal of Manure etc. from Slaughterhouses in the City of Glasgow.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 7 of the principal Order as amended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) (Amendment) Order of 1929 manure or waste meat trimmings or any other refuse may be moved from any slaughterhouse in the City of Glasgow for conveyance by barge to a
