

Company") to sell so much of the undertaking of the Company authorised by the South Durham Districts Electricity Special Order 1927 as is situate within the Parishes or Townships of Barmpton, Great Burdon, Haughton-le-Skerne, Morton Palms, Neasham, Sadberge and Whessoe in the Rural District of Darlington (hereinafter called "the said Parishes or Townships") and the rights powers authorities privileges obligations and liabilities of the Company as undertakers under and in respect of so much of the South Durham Districts Electricity Special Order 1927 as relates to the said Parishes or Townships or any of them and to confirm any agreement or agreements which have been or may be entered into between the Corporation and the Company in that behalf.

2. To revoke so much of the said South Durham Districts Electricity Special Order 1927 as relates to the said Parishes or Townships or to apply some of the provisions of that Order to the Corporation and to render the same inapplicable to the Company.

3. To extend the area of supply within which the Corporation are authorised to supply electricity so as to include therein the said Parishes or Townships and the Parishes or Townships of Archdeacon Newton and Low Coniscliffe in the same Rural District (all of which Parishes or Townships are hereinafter together referred to as "the added area").

4. To authorise the Corporation to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928 within the added area and to prescribe and limit the prices to be charged for electricity supplied therein.

5. To provide for the laying down of electric lines in certain streets and parts of streets in the added area within a period to be specified in the Order.

6. To authorise the Corporation to open and break up streets and parts of streets in the added area which are not repairable by the local authority and railways.

7. To extend and make applicable to the added area and to the purposes of the Order or some of them all or some of the powers and provisions of the Darlington Electric Lighting Order 1890 the Darlington Electric Lighting Order 1898 the Borough of Darlington Order 1914 and the Darlington Electricity (Extension) Special Order 1927 and to apply

such provisions to the undertaking to be authorised by the Order subject to such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein and to revoke any Orders which may have been made by the Electricity Commissioners under Section 6 of the Electric Lighting Act 1909 in relation to the supply by the Corporation of electricity to premises within the added area.

8. To confer upon the Corporation all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, and the enactments incorporated therewith and to alter vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Order and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

And notice is hereby also given that the draft of the Order has been deposited at the office of the Electricity Commissioners and printed copies of the draft Order as applied for and of the Order when made may be obtained (at the price of two shillings for each copy) at "Torvale," The Stray, Eastbourne, Darlington, and at the offices of the undermentioned Town Clerk and Parliamentary Agents.

Copies of the draft Order and of the maps showing the proposed added area and the streets within which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a specified time have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Durham at Durham, at the office of the Town Clerk, at Houndgate, Darlington, and at the office of the Clerk to the Darlington Rural District Council at Darlington.

Any local or other public authority company body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the application must do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 6th day of January, 1930, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the undersigned Town Clerk or Parliamentary Agents.
