COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

RELIGHTING OF SAFETY LAMPS BELOW GROUND.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 20th December, 1929, he made an Order under Sections 33 and 35 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911 and the Coal Mines General Regulations (Safety Lamps) 1927, authorising and prescribing conditions for the use in mines under the Coal Mines Act, of flame safety lamps fitted with self-contained relighting devices.

The Order, which may be cited as the Safety Lamps (Relighting) Order of 1929, re-enacts, with slight amendment, the Safety Lamps (Relighting) Order of 1927; and comes into force on 1st January, 1930.

CENSUS OF PRODUCTION.

The Census of Production (1931) Order, 1929, dated December 13, 1929, made by the Board of Trade, determining that a Census of Production shall be taken in the Year 1931.

Whereas by Section 1, sub-section (2) of the Census of Production Act, 1917 (7—8 Geo. 5. c. 2) it is enacted that a Census shall be taken in any year which is fixed for the purpose by an Order made by the Board of Trade and laid before Parliament, provided that there is at least a year's interval between the date on which the Order is made by the Board of Trade and the commencement of the year in which the Census is to be taken.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 1, sub-section (2) of the Census of Production Act, 1917, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

(1) A Census of Production shall be taken in the year 1931 in respect of production in the year 1930.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Census of Production (1931) Order, 1929.
