"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop of Bristol for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and of the said New Parish of Swindon New Town which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Saints, Swindon.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said George, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, Swindon, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Rodbourne Cheney, in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the west and upon the south west by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Swindon, upon the south by the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Swindon New Town, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, from the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney, at the point where the boundary of the Municipal Borough of Swindon crosses the middle of the stream known as Hreod Burna, and extending thence first north

westward and then in various directions along the middle of Hreod Burna for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the fence which divides the close numbered 335 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Rodbourne Cheney published in the year 1923 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map of Plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 336 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward then westward and then again southward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 335 and the close numbered 334 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 336 and the close numbered 366 upon the same maps for a distance of 231 chains or thereabouts to the boundary of the said Municipal Borough of Swindon, and extending thence westward along the said Municipal Borough Boundary for a distance of 23½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Augustine, Swindon.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Swindon New Town which is bounded upon the north partly by the above described portion of the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney and partly by the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Gorse Hill, Swindon, upon the east by the Parish of Swindon, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Swindon from the said New Parish of Swindon New Town at the junction of Cricklade Road with the roadway leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Beatrice Street, and extending thence first westward and then south westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitehouse Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Whitehouse Road for a distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Swindon New Town from the said Parish of Rodbourne Cheney."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.
