WINCHESTER.—Forthwith and entirely in the Saint Faith's Churchyard: provided that:

In such earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard as can be opened to a depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed, at their decease, of widows, widowers, parents and children of those already interred therein.
