the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury are desirable and should be carried into effect and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the Parishes of Chislet; Reculver with Hoath; and Westbere, at present in the Rural Deanery of Westbere, in the said Archdeaconry of Canterbury, shall be trans-ferred to the Rural Deanery of Canterbury, in the same Archdeaconry and the name of the said Rural Deanery of Westbere shall be altered so that such Rural Deanery shall henceforth be called ' The Rural Deanery of Thanet ' and each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred and shall not belong to or be a part of any other

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.
