PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 26th day of June, 1855, directing the discontinuance of burials, in, amongst other places, the Church and Churchyard of St. Clements, Cambridge:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 26th day of June, 1855, should be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order shall be varied so that, notwithstanding anything therein, the burial of the body of the Reverend Canon Edmund Gough de Salis Wood may be allowed, at his decease, in the said Churchyard.

THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION)
NO. 1 ORDER, 1930, DATED 26TH MARCH, 1930,
MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF
THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 GEO. 5. C. 22).

Whereas it is provided by Sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 22) that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect

of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf hereby order as follows:—

1. Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the 1st day of April, 1930, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1930.

2. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 1 Order, 1930.
