In Parliament.—Session 1929-30.

HARTLEPOOL GAS AND WATER.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the present Session by the Hartlepool Gas and Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for leave to introduce a Bill of which the principal subject matters are as follows:—

New waterworks in the County of Durham comprising the following:—

Work No. 1.—(Dalton Reservoir).—A reservoir on Dalton Beck Char Beck Bogle Beck and Cradock Beck to collect the waters of those becks and their tributaries at "The Howls" partly in the parish of Dalton Piercy and partly in the parish of Elwick all in the Hartlepool Rural District to be formed by means of an embankment to be placed across the Dalton Beck;

Work No. 2.—A conduit or line of pipes wholly in the parish of Dalton Piercy in the Hartlepool Rural District commencing in Dalton Piercy Lane by a junction with an existing main belonging to the Company and terminating in the intended Dalton Reservoir;

Work No. 3.—A conduit or line of pipes wholly in the said parish and rural district commencing in the intended Dalton Reservoir and terminating by a junction with the said existing main which crosses over Dalton Beck at the north side of the public road bridge over the said Beck;

Appropriation of waters of Dalton Beck and other waters; Acquisition of and powers as to lands, easements buildings etc.; Modification of Lands Clauses Acts; Exercise of powers of Section 12 of Waterworks Clauses Act 1847;

To confer further powers upon the Company in relation to their Water Undertaking with regard to the following, among other, matters:—

Agreements for a supply of water to owners etc. of premises not entitled to demand a supply; discharge of water into streams, etc.; separate continuation or service pipes and repair thereof; supply of water for washing horses, carriages, motor cars etc., and refrigerating apparatus, and for partly trade purposes and to certain classes of institutions buildings and premises; special charges for such supply and exemption from obligation to supply except by meter;

Increase and alteration of existing and new or additional rates, rents and charges and revision thereof; basis of charge; inspection of premises supplied; and pressure.

To confer further powers upon the Company in relation to their Gas Undertaking with regard to the following, among other, matters:—

Charges for special reading of meters; the provision of valves where high-pressure air or other gas is used; the construction and placing of pipes and fittings between mains and meters and requiring the use of anti-fluctuators in certain cases; agreements with other undertakers as to interchange of facilities and supply in bulk and consequential and other provisions; cutting off supplies and recovery of cost; inspection, etc. of meters, fittings, etc.

Additional capital and borrowing powers and other financial provisions; Application of funds and revenues; Meetings, voting, interim dividends, directors, officers, auditors; profit sharing and co-partnership schemes among employees; pensions etc.; subscriptions etc. to infirmaries etc.; breaking up streets; telephons or telegraph posts and other purposes.

Amendment of Section 35 of Waterworks Clauses Act 1847; Guarantees by local authorities.

Agreements with and powers to local authorities, companies and persons.

Bye-laws and regulations; Penalties; Notices; Incorporation, extension, amendment and repeal etc. of Acts, etc.

Plans and sections showing the lines situations and levels of the works to be authorised by the Bill, the plans showing also the lands intended to be taken or used compulsorily under the powers of the Bill and a book of reference to such plans containing the names of owners and lessees or reputed owners and lessees and of the occupiers of such lands was on or before the 4th day of April 1930 deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Durham at his office at Shire Hall Durham and with the Clerk of the Rural District Council of Hartlepool at his office at West Hartlepool; and on or before the same day copies of so much of the said plans sections and book of reference as relates to each of the areas hereinafter mentioned were deposited for public inspection as follows (that is to say):—

So far as relates to the Parish of Elwick with the Clerk of the Parish Council of such Parish at his office at Elwick, and so far as relates to the Parish of Dalton Piercy with the Chairman of the Parish Meeting of such Parish at his residence.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Committee and Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 10th day of April 1930, and on and after the 11th day of April 1930 a copy of the Bill may be inspected and copies obtained at the price of five shillings each at the Offices of the under-mentioned.

A notice stating the objects of the application has been and will be published in full in the Northern Daily Mail of the 1st and 8th April 1930.
