EDUCATIONAL ENDOWMENTS (SCOT-LAND) COMMISSION.

> University of Edinburgh. SHAW PHILOSOPHICAL FELLOWSHIP.

Scheme under the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1928, for the Administration of the Endowment known as the Shaw Philosophical Fellowship, hitherto held and administered under a Deed of Foundation the late Sir James Shaw, Baronet, dated 10th, 13th, 20th, 21st and 24th May, and recorded in the Books of Council and Session 3rd June, 1867.

Preamble.

Whereas by the said Deed of Foundation the subscribers therein named gave and mortified to the University of Edinburgh certain funds which are an educational endowment within the meaning of the Educational Endowments (Scotland) Act, 1928; and whereas the University Court of the said University have intimated in writing their consent to the said endowment being dealt with under the said Act; and whereas it appears to the Commissioners under the said Act, after due examination and inquiry that; in order to extend the usefulness of the said endowment, the administration thereof should be amended and in some respects altered: Therefore the said endowment shall, from and after the date upon which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares His approbation hereof, be held and administered for the purposes, with the powers, and under the conditions and provisions hereinafter set forth.

Vesting of funds.

1. The funds of the endowment shall remain vested in the University Court of the University of Edinburgh, and shall be held and administered by the Court under the conby subscribers to a Fund for a Memorial to | ditions and provisions of this Scheme.

Business arrangements.

2. The business of the endowment shall be conducted either at ordinary meetings of the Court or at meetings summoned for the purpose which shall be convened and conducted according to the ordinary rules and practice of the Court (hereinafter referred to as "the governing body").

Administrative powers.

3. The governing body shall have power to do any of the acts set forth in section 4 of the Trusts (Scotland) Act, 1921, or in any Act amending the said section, provided that in every contract of employment entered into by them the governing body shall take power to dismiss at pleasure any officer employed by them.

Powers of investment.

4. The governing body shall have the powers of investment conferred upon trustees by the Trusts (Scotland) Act, 1921, or by any Act amending the same.

Accounts.

5. The governing body shall cause full accounts to be kept of the capital, income, and expenditure vested in, received by, and expended by them under this Scheme in such form and manner as the Scottish Universities Committee of the Privy Council may from time to time prescribe. Such accounts shall be kept each year from the 1st day of August to the 31st day of July, and, after the same have been examined and passed by the governing body, an abstract thereof in such form as the Committee may from time to time prescribe shall be transmitted to the Committee, and after such audit as is hereinafter provided, the abstract or such abridgment thereof as the Committee may approve shall be published by the governing body in one or more of the newspapers circulating throughout Scotland.

Audit.

6. The accounts of the endowment shall be audited in such manner as the Scottish Universities Committee of the Privy Council may from time to time prescribe, and the cost of such audit shall be paid out of the funds of the endowment.

Vested interests.

7. Nothing in this Scheme shall affect any vested interest of any individual holding any office, place, employment, pension, compensation allowance, fellowship or emolument under or arising out of the endowment on the third day of August, 1928, but every interest, right, privilege, or preference which any person may have acquired or may acquire after said date in or relative to the said endowment, or in or relative to any office, place, employment, pension, compensation allowance, fellowship or emolument in the gift of the governing body, shall be subject to the provisions of this Scheme.

Application of income.

8. The governing body, after paying the necessary expenses of management, and the burdens and taxes affecting the endowment, shall pay the free annual income to the holder of the Shaw Philosophical Fellowship: Provided that if in any year the fellowship

is vacant owing to there being no candidates, or through lack of candidates of sufficient merit, or through the death or resignation of the holder, or through forfeiture or suspension of the fellowship under section 12 hereof, or through any other cause, the governing body shall add the unexpended balance to the capital of the endowment.

Award.

9. The fellowship shall be in the patronage of the Senatus Academicus of the University of Edinburgh (hereinafter referred to as "the patrons"), and shall be awarded by the patrons after competitive examination, written and oral, in the subjects of logic, metaphysics (including psychology), moral philosophy and the history of philosophy, in accordance with the report or reports obtained under section 10 hereof: Provided that if the examiners or a majority thereof shall report that none of the candidates has exhibited a sufficiently high degree of proficiency to merit the award of the fellowship, it shall be in the power of the patrons to refrain from awarding it to any competitor.

Examinations.

- 10.—(1) The patrons shall, by regulation under section 15 hereof, appoint a month during which, on each occurrence of a vacancy, a competitive examination for the fellowship shall be held:
- (2)—(a) On each occasion upon which the fellowship is about to become vacant through expiry of the term of tenure, the patrons shall offer it for competition and shall arrange for the examination to be held during the next appointed month:
- (b) If the fellowship becomes vacant through death, resignation, or withdrawal, the patrons shall offer it for competition and shall cause the examination to be held during the first appointed month following the date of the vacancy, provided that if the vacancy occurs within six months of the first appointed month, the examination shall not be held until the appointed month in the following year:
- (c) If no candidate offers himself for examination, or if the patrons refrain from awarding the fellowship under section 9 hereof, the fellowship shall remain vacant for one year, at the expiry of which it shall again be offered for competition and the examination shall be held during the appointed month:
- (3) Examinations shall be held in Edinburgh during the appointed month under the following conditions:—
 - (a) The patrons shall at least six months before the date of the examination give public intimation of the vacancy or impending vacancy and of the date, place and subjects of examination:
 - (b) The examinations shall, except in the case below provided for, be conducted by two examiners, one to be appointed by the patrons and one by the Senatus Academicus of one of the other Scottish Universities viz.: the University of St. Andrews, the University of Glasgow and the University of Aberdeen in rotation in the manner following:—
 - (i) On the first occasion of a competition for the fellowship the patrons shall

at least six months before the date fixed for the examination make application to the Senatus Academicus of the University of St. Andrews to appoint an examiner from among the members of their own body or others;

- (ii) on the second occasion of a competition the Senatus Academicus of the University of Glasgow shall in like manner be requested to appoint an examiner;
- (iii) on the third occasion of a competition the Senatus Academicus of the University of Aberdeen shall in like manner be requested to appoint an examiner:
- (iv) on the fourth occasion of a competition the Senatus Academicus of the University of St. Andrews shall be again requested to appoint an examiner and so on in the same rotation as before:

Provided that if on any occasion the Senatus Academicus of any of the three last named Universities, after being applied to as above, shall omit to intimate to the patrons within six weeks from the receipt of the application that they have appointed an examiner, the patrons shall, in that case, apply in like manner to the Senatus Academicus of the University next in order as above; and failing their duly appointing an examiner, then application shall be made to the Senatus of the remaining University to appoint one, and if on any occasion, after due application has been made successively as above, no examiner shall be appointed by the Senatus Academicus of any of the said Universities of St. Andrews or of Glasgow or of Aberdeen, the patrons shall in that case appoint the other examiner:

- (c) Any appointment of an examiner under the last mentioned proviso shall be deemed to have been made by the Senatus entitled to appoint the examiner in ordinary rotation:
- (d) The examiners appointed shall report their opinion of the result of the examination to the patrons: Provided that if the examiners are divided in opinion as to the merits of the candidates or are of opinion that two or more of the candidates have an equal claim to the fellowship the patrons shall apply to the Senatus of one of the Universities who have not appointed an examiner to appoint a third examiner, and if the said Senatus shall not have appointed said examiner within fourteen days the patrons shall themselves appoint a third examiner who shall thereafter report his opinion of the results of the examination to the patrons.

Qualification of candidates.

11. The fellowship shall be open to graduates in Arts of any of the Scottish Universities of not more than three years standing at the time of the said examination, and to students of said Universities who, although they have not graduated in Arts, have successfully passed the last of the examinations necessary for such graduation within the period of three years before the time of the said examination: Provided that it shall be in the power of the patrons in special circumstances, with the consent of any two of the Senates of the other

Scottish Universities, to extend the qualifying period.

Conditions of tenure.

12. The fellowship shall be tenable for three years, and it shall be in the power of the patrons in special circumstances to allow any person to hold the fellowship along with any other fellowship, scholarship, bursary or other benefit of a like nature. It shall also be in the power of the patrons to require any holder of the fellowship who is not engaged in University teaching to pursue higher studies or to engage in original research.

Withdrawal of fellowship.

13. Where the holder of the fellowship has been guilty of gross misconduct the patrons may by resolution withdraw the fellowship or suspend the holder from the benefits thereof. Said resolution shall forthwith be intimated to the holder by registered letter. The holder shall have the right to appeal within eight days to the governing body. The governing body shall hear and determine any such appeal with all convenient speed, and the decision of the governing body thereon shall be final. In the event of no appeal being made or of the resolution of the patrons being affirmed on appeal, the said resolution shall take effect as from its date.

Regulations by governing body.

14. It shall be in the power of the governing body to make such regulations as they think fit for the exercise of their powers under this Scheme, provided that said regulations shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme. They may in the same manner alter and repeal said regulations.

Regulations by patrons.

15. The patrons shall, with the approval of the governing body, make regulations for the award and tenure of the fellowship, provided that nothing in said regulations shall be inconsistent with the provisions of this Scheme. The patrons may with the like approval alter and repeal said regulations.

Power of alteration.

16. If it shall at any time appear to the patrons that any department of the Faculties of Arts in the Scottish Universities is more in need of encouragement than the department to which the fellowship is then appropriated, the patrons by a majority of not less than three-fourths of their number, including in said majority not less than three-fourths of the Professors in the Faculty of Arts in the University of Edinburgh, and with the consent of the governing body and of any two of the Senates of the other Scottish Universities may appropriate the fellowship to such department.

Printing.

17. The governing body shall maintain a supply of printed copies of this Scheme and shall cause a copy to be kept available for inspection by every member and officer of the governing body and of the patrons upon their entry into office, and copies shall be sold at a reasonable price to all persons applying for the same.

Citation.

18. This Scheme may be cited as the Shaw Philosophical Fellowship Scheme, 1930.

THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

COUNTY OF THE EAST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th day of April, 1930, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act, 1920, in respect of certain highways in the County of the East Riding of Yorkshire.

The Order will come into force on the 5th day of May, 1930, and is to the following effect:—

I. During the period of five years from the date on which the Order comes into force, no person shall, save as hereinafter provided, drive or cause to be driven on the highways specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said highways") any

locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

- (i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said highways or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;
- (ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said highways; or

(iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said highways, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said highways of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

7. The Registrars of the existing Long Ashton and St. George Sub-districts shall be the Registrars of the Clevedon and Portishead Sub-districts respectively.

SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY.

Bye-laws relating to the Conveyance, Embarkation and Disembarkation of Passengers, Animals and Goods in, on, or from Steam Vessels.

Bys-laws made by the Southern Railway Company, with the approval of the Minister of Transport, in relation to passengers, animals, and goods, conveyed in or upon any steam vessels, provided, owned, or worked, by the Company, and in relation to the embarkation or disembarkation of passengers, animals, and goods, on or from such vessels, by virtue of Section 51 of the Southern Railway Act, 1929, Section 32 of the Railway Clauses Act, 1863, and in exercise of every other power in that behalf vested in the Southern Railway Company.

All previous bye-laws made by the Company relating to their steamer services are hereby rescinded.

Definitions.

1. In these bye-laws, unless therein otherwise expressly provided, or unless the context shall otherwise require, the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"The Company."

"The Company" shall mean the Southern Railway Company.

" Vessel."

"Vessel" shall mean any steam vessel, provided, owned, or worked, by the Company for the conveyance or carriage of passengers, animals, minerals, goods, merchandize or things of any description.

Passengers to obtain tickets.

2. No passenger, without the permission of the Company, shall embark on a vessel, for the purpose of travelling thereon, unless he, or someone on his behalf, shall have obtained from the Company, or their Agent, a ticket entitling him to travel on the vessel, but, if the Company shall give permission to any passenger to embark without a ticket entitling him to travel therein, he shall obtain such ticket from the Company's duly authorised servant or agent on board such vessel as soon as may be reasonably practicable.

Issue of tickets at intermediate ports.

3. At any intermediate port or place, fares will be received and tickets issued conditionally only on there being room in the vessel for which such tickets shall be issued. In case there shall not be sufficient room for all the passengers to or for whom such tickets shall have been issued, the holders of such as shall be for the longest distances, shall, as far as may be reasonably practicable, have preference, and the holders of such as shall be for the same distance, shall as far as may be reasonably practicable, have priority according to the order in which such tickets shall have been issued, as denoted by the numbers stamped thereon. The Company are not, however, to be deemed to undertake that such order of preference or priority shall be adhered to.

Fares to intermediate ports.

4. When the fare to an intermediate port or place exceeds the fare to a more distant port or place, no person shall, for the purpose of travelling to such intermediate port or place, take or use, or attempt to use, a ticket for the more distant port or place, with intent to avoid payment of the additional fare to such intermediate port or place. The liability to, or the infliction of, any penalty incurred by the infraction of this bye-law shall not prejudice any right of the Company to treat such ticket as forfeited, and to recover the full fare for the distance actually travelled by the offender.

Altering or defacing tickets, etc. Using altered tickets, etc.

5. No person shall (a) alter, deface, mutilate or destroy any passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, bicycle ticket, or other ticket, after it has been issued and whilst it is available for use, with intent to enable the Company to be defrauded or prejudiced; or (b) knowingly and wilfully use, or attempt to use, any

passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, or bicycle ticket, or other ticket, which shall have been in any respect materially altered, defaced or mutilated.

Selling, buying or transferring tickets, etc.

Using transferred tickets, etc.

6. No person shall (a) sell or buy, or attempt to sell or buy, any ticket (which expression in this bye-law includes any passenger ticket, season ticket, dog ticket, bicycle ticket, book of passenger tickets, or other ticket, and any portion detached from the remainder of any such ticket or book) or transfer or receive any partly used ticket, or any season ticket, to or from any other person with intent that any person shall use the same for the purpose of travelling or conveyance upon any vessel, unless the ticket shall, at the time of issuing thereof, purport to be transferable, or (b) knowingly and wilfully use, or attempt to use, any ticket which has been sold, bought, transferred or received in contravention of this bye-law.

Provided that the sale, or attempted sale, by, or the purchase, or attempted purchase from, a duly authorised servant or agent of the Company is excepted from the provisions of this bye-law.

Entry on any part of vessel not provided for passengers, etc.

7. No passenger shall, without the permission of an officer of the vessel, enter or remain on or in any part of a vessel other than that provided for the conveyance of passengers, or on or in any part of a vessel which may be enclosed by chain, rope, or other barrier, or which may bear a notice that it is reserved.

Entering or leaving vessel in motion, etc.

Times at which persons may enter or leave.

User of gangways.

8. No person (except in case of accident or other emergency) shall enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any vessel whilst it is in motion, or otherwise than by a gangway, or except at such times as the Company may reasonably appoint; and where on any vessel one gangway is provided for entrance thereto and another gangway for exit therefrom, no person (except as aforesaid) shall embark or disembark, or attempt to embark or disembark, on or from such vessel, except by the gangway provided for entrance or exit respectively.

Persons suffering from infectious or contagious disease, etc.

9. The Company may refuse to receive or carry on board any vessel any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or disorder; and if any person so suffering shall enter or attempt to enter, or if any person having the charge or direction of any person so suffering shall cause or permit such person to enter or attempt to enter, any vessel without first giving notice of such infectious or contagious disease or disorder to the Officer of the Company in charge of embarkation, or to the Master or other Officer of the vessel, he shall be guilty of an offence against this bye-law; provided always that it shall be a good defence if he shows that he was not aware of and did not suspect and had no reason to suspect the

existence of such infectious or contagious disease or disorder.

Intoxicated persons, etc.

10.—(a) No person in a state of intoxication, or who is in an unfit or improper condition to travel, shall enter any vessel; and

(b) Except by permission of a servant or agent of the Company, no person shall enter a cabin whose dress or clothing is in a condition liable to soil or injure the linings or cushions thereof or the dress or clothing of any passenger travelling therein.

Male passengers not to travel in any part of vessel reserved for females, and females not to travel in any part reserved for males.

11. Except by permission of a servant or agent of the Company, no person of the male sex, above the age of eight years, shall travel or attempt to travel or remain in any cabin or other part of a vessel marked or notified as being reserved or appropriated for the exclusive use of persons of the female sex, and no person of the female sex shall travel, or attempt to travel, or remain, in any cabin, or other part of a vessel marked or notified as being appropriated or reserved for the exclusive use of persons of the male sex.

Offensive animals or goods.

12. The Company may refuse to receive or carry on board any vessel any animal or goods of an offensive nature; and if any person shall send or attempt to send by any vessel or carry or attempt to carry in any vessel any animal or goods of an offensive nature without first giving notice of the offensive nature thereof to the Officer of the Company in charge of embarkation, or to the Master or other Officer of the vessel, he shall be guilty of an offence against this bye-law; provided always that it shall be a good defence if he shows that he was not aware and did not suspect and had no reason to suspect that the animal or goods, as the case may be, were of an offensive nature.

In this bye-law, the expression "offensive nature" means a nature, quality or condition calculated or likely to cause injury or annoyance to any person on board the vessel or damage to any property thereon.

Dogs, etc.

13.—(i) No person shall send, or attempt to send, by any vessel, or carry or attempt to carry in any vessel, any dog, bird, animal or other creature unless (a) such dog, bird, animal or other creature shall be properly and sufficiently secured, or otherwise under proper and sufficient control and (b) such person shall, before embarking, produce to an officer or servant of the Company if required by him so to do, any necessary licence or permit authorizing the disembarkation of such dog, bird, animal or other creature at the destination port.

(ii) No person having the charge of any dog, bird, animal, or other creature in any vessel shall (a) take the same or cause or permit the same to be taken into or allow the same to remain in any cabin if requested not to do so by an Officer or servant of the Company; or (b) permit the same to cause annoyance or injury to any person or damage to any property.

(iii) The person in charge of any dog, bird,

animal or other creature, shall, if so required by any officer or servant of the Company so to do, deliver it into the custody of such officer or servant until the vessel reaches the destination port.

Bookmaking betting or wagering, etc.

14.—(a) No person shall enter on, or use, any vessel for the purpose of bookmaking or betting or wagering, or agreeing to bet or wager, or paying or receiving or settling bets with any other person.

Playing games.

(b) No person playing for money or moneysworth at any game or pretended game of chance and or skill in or upon any vessel shall continue to do so after having been requested by any servant or agent of the Company to desist therefrom.

Loitering, etc.

(c) No person shall, without lawful justification or excuse, enter, loiter or remain on any vessel. Any person entering, or who shall have entered, on a vessel, shall, whenever required so to do by any duly authorised servant of the Company truly inform him of the respects in which such person claims to be entitled to be thereon.

Disorderly conduct, etc.

15. No person shall at any time, while in or upon a vessel, (a) use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive language to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person; or (b) behave in a riotous, disorderly, indecent or offensive manner, to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person; or (c) write, draw, or affix any abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive word, representation, or characters, upon any part of the vessel or the equipment thereof; or (d) commit any nuisance; or (e) molest, or wilfully interfere with the comfort or convenience of, any passenger or person, or (f) without the permission in writing of the Company's Docks and Marine Manager for the time being, play any instrument, sing, or dance.

Smoking.

16. No person shall smoke in any public cabin in any vessel which is not provided for smoking, or in or upon any part of the vessel where smoking is expressly prohibited by the Company, or, if requested by any servant or agent of the Company not to do so, in or upon any part of the vessel where smoking may be dangerous.

Hawking, touting, etc. .

17. Except by permission in writing from the Company's Docks and Marine Manager for the time being, no person, while in or upon a vessel, shall hawk, sell, or expose or offer for sale, any article or goods whatsoever, or tout, ply for, or solicit alms, reward, custom or employment of any description.

Throwing articles from vessel, etc.

18. No person shall pour, throw or drop from any vessel, any liquid, article, matter or thing whatsoever in such manner as to be calculated or likely to soil, damage or injure any person or property.

Spitting.

19. No person shall spit upon the deck, or upon any other part of any vessel, or any place used for the embarkation or disembarkation of passengers.

Interfering with machinery, etc.

20. No person shall improperly, wantonly or maliciously interfere with, or move or set in motion, any machinery, gangway, mooring, plant, lights, fittings, signals, appliance or equipment used or provided on or in connection with any vessel.

Damaging Property.

21. No person shall wilfully, wantonly or maliciously break, cut, scratch, tear, soil, deface, damage or remove any part of a vessel, or any of the fittings, furniture, decorations or equipment thereof, or any plant, appliance or property used or provided on or in connection therewith, or any notice, advertisement, number-plate, number, figure or letter therein or thereon.

Obstruction, etc.

22. No person shall wilfully do or cause to be done anything in such a manner (a) as to obstruct or injure any part of the machinery or tackle used in the mooring of a vessel or in the loading or unloading thereof or in the embarkation or disembarkation thereof; or (b) as to obstruct, impede or molest the servants of the Company or any of them in the mooring of a vessel, or in the loading or unloading thereof, or in the embarkation or disembarkation thereof, or otherwise in the execution of their duty in, about or in connection with a vessel.

Leaving animals or articles on vessel.

23. No person shall leave or place any animal, vehicle, cycle or any luggage, goods, article or thing, or cause the same to be left or placed, on, in or about any vessel in contravention of any reasonable direction of an officer of the vessel.

Lost Property, etc.

24. Every person who shall find in or upon any vessel any article or thing, which shall have been lost or mislaid, shall hand the same or give a full description thereof to an officer or servant of the Company without delay, unless the article or thing has been delivered to the owner.

Penalties.

25. Any person doing anything prohibited by, or otherwise offending against, any of the foregoing bye-laws numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 23 and 24 respectively, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for a first offence, and not exceeding £5 for any subsequent offence; and any person doing anything prohibited by, or otherwise offending against, any of the foregoing bye-laws numbered 20, 21 and 22 respectively, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Power to interfere to obviate or remove danger, etc.

26. If the infraction or non-observance of any of the foregoing bye-laws be attended with danger or annoyance to the public or hindrance to the Company in the lawful use of the vessel, it shall be lawful for the Company summarily to interfere to obviate or remove such danger, annoyance or hindrance, and that without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of any such bye-law.
