COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

EXPLOSIVES.IN COAL MINES.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 15th April, 1930, he made an Order in pursuance of Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, amending the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913 (relating to "Permitted" explosives).

The effect of the new Order is

- (a) to add to the List of Permitted Explosives, with a uniform maximum permissible charge of 28 ozs., thirty-five explosives which have passed the revised Official Test;
- (b) to reduce to 28 ozs. the maximum permissible charge of explosives already on the Permitted List which previously had maximum permissible charges in excess of 28 ozs.;
- (c) to amend the definitions of certain explosives already on the Permitted List; and
- (d) to remove from the Permitted List certain explosives which are no longer manufactured or used.
