The KING has been pleased, by Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the 23rd instant, to appoint Sir Robert Francis Dunnell, Bt., K.C.B., to be a Commissioner under the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Sir John Charles Lewis Coward, K.C.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that he has certified electrolytic plating or oxidation of metal articles by the use of an electrolyte containing chromic acid or salts of chromium, and processes incidental thereto, to be dangerous, and that he proposes to make Regulations under Section 79 of the Act, to apply to all factories and workshops or parts thereof in which the electrolytic plating or oxidation of metal articles by the use of an electrolyte containing chromic acid or salts of chromium is carried out.

Copies of the Regulations proposed to be made may be obtained on application to the Chief Inspector of Factories, Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1.

Any objection to the draft Regulations must be sent to the Secretary of State, at the Home Office, Whitehall, London, S.W. 1, within 40

days after the date of this notice. The objection must be in writing and must state:—

- (a) the draft Regulations or portions of draft Regulations objected to;
- (b) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (c) the omissions, additions and modifications asked for.

PETROLEUM (CONSOLIDATION) ACT, 1928.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Secretary of State for the Home Department proposes, after the expiration of forty days from this date, to make Regulations in pursuance of Section 6 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, as applied by Order in Council dated the 20th January, 1930, as to the conveyance by road of vessels containing compressed therein the gases specified in the First Schedule to the Regulations, namely: air, argon, carbon monoxide, coal gas, hydrogen, methane, neon, nitrogen and oxygen.
