His Majesty's Government are in process of presenting to the Mexican Government claims of British subjects against Mexico arising out of events which took place before the renewal of diplomatic relations between Great Britain and Mexico on the 28th August, 1925.

Any British subject possessing such a claim and desiring that it shall be presented to the Mexican Government by His Majesty's Government is requested to notify the Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, Foreign Office, Downing Street, S.W.1, forthwith to that effect, furnishing him at the same time with full particulars of the claim unless these have already been communicated either to the Foreign Office or to His Majesty's Legation at Mexico City.

Special attention is drawn to the fact that this announcement does *not* refer to claims arising from revolutionary acts (as defined in the Anglo-Mexican Special Claims Convention of November 19th, 1926), which took place in Mexico during the period comprised between November 20th, 1910, and May 31st, 1920. No further action is required in regard to such claims provided that they do in effect fall within the scope of the Anglo-Mexican Special Claims Commission which is at present considering them.

#### ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND MAY, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

##### *Authorisation of Landing of Animal for Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

##### *Definition of Quarantine Station.*

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

##### *Examination before Landing.*

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal

has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations applicable to the Animal on Landing.*

4.—(1) The animal on being landed, shall forthwith be moved from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animal shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (*Fifth*) of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.
