<p>AT STRAND AND SOUTHAMPTON STREET, W.C.</p> <p><i>In three portions.</i></p>	<p>Nine Hackney Carriages:</p> <p><i>First Portion.</i>—At Strand, four carriages in centre of roadway, two on either side of the Refuge opposite No. 392, Strand: the first carriage to stand at a point opposite the Eastern building line of the entrance to the Hotel Cecil; and the third carriage to stand four feet East of the Eastern end of the Refuge.</p> <p>Front of vehicles toward the West.</p> <p><i>Second Portion.</i>—At Southampton Street, two carriages in the centre of roadway, commencing at a point in line with No. 1, Southampton Street and extending Northward as far as necessary for two carriages.</p> <p>Front of vehicles toward the South.</p> <p>NOTE:—The second portion of the Standing will be removed whilst cabs are waiting on the East Side of Southampton Street, between Strand and Tavistock Street, for the purpose of taking up company at the Vaudeville Theatre.</p> <p><i>Third Portion.</i>—At Southampton Street, three carriages on the East side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the Northern building line of Tavistock Street, and extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for three carriages.</p> <p>Front of vehicles toward the South.</p> <p>The first portion of the Standing to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion and the second portion by carriages from the third portion.</p>
