

(fourthly) all that portion of the said Parish of Croydon, which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured brown shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Broad Green, Croydon; (fifthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, which is described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon; and (sixthly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, and of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, which are described in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Consolidated Chapelry respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

*"The First Schedule.*

"The territory to be restored to the Parish of Croydon, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, being:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, which forms part of the Haling Park Estate and which has been acquired by the Whitgift Foundation as a site and grounds for the proposed new Whitgift Grammar School.

"II. And also all that portion of the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north and upon the west by the said Parish of Croydon and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the south east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Croydon from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, at the junction of the road called Duppas Hill Terrace with Duppas Hill Lane, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Duppas Hill Lane for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Prospect Place, and extending thence first north westward and then north eastward along the middle of Prospect Place for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road known as Old Town, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Old Town for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its

junction with Union Street, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Union Street for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the passage which leads from Union Street to Church Road, and extending thence north eastward to and then first north eastward and then northward along the middle of such passage for a distance in all of 2¼ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, from the said Parish of Croydon.

*"The Second Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Croydon which is bounded upon the west and upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the north west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, from the said Parish of Croydon at the junction of Park Lane with Friends' Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Friends' Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with High Street, and extending thence northward along the middle of High Street, for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitgift Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Whitgift Street for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wandle Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Wandle Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Scarbrook Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Scarbrook Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Church Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Croydon from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon.

*"The Third Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the new Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Croydon which lies to the north of the middle of George Street with the exception of the premises attached to the School of the Whitgift Foundation known as the Whitgift Grammar School (including the houses and premises known as Numbers 19 and 21, Wellesley Road) and also of the premises attached to the Whitgift Almshouses.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Christ Church, Broad Green, Croydon, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Croydon which is bounded upon the north-east by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Broad Green, Croydon, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and
