

shall be a member nominated by the Warden and Fellows" there shall be substituted the words:

"which shall include (1) the Warden of All Souls College or if he is unable or unwilling to act a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion and (2) a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows".

That in Clause 3 of the same Statute there shall be inserted immediately after the word "no" the words "payment shall be made from the revenues of the College to the Curators of the University Chest in respect of any" and the words "shall be entitled to receive any payment from the revenues of the College" shall be omitted from the said Clause.

That in Statute VII, Clause 1, sub-clauses (ii), (iii), (iv) and (vi) be repealed and that the numbers (ii), (iii), (iv) and (vi) be omitted from the concluding paragraph of the said Clause.

That in Clause 2, sub-clause (i) of the same Statute for the words "Charges (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv)" shall be substituted the words "Charge (i)" and the number "(vi)" shall be omitted from the said sub-clause.

That in sub-clause (ii) of the same Clause the number (vi) shall be omitted.

That in the concluding paragraph of the said Clause the words "Charge (vii)" shall be substituted for the words "Charges (iv), (vi) and (vii)"; the words "the Professor or Reader" shall be substituted for the words "each of the several Professors or Readers"; and the words "which shall include (1) the Warden of All Souls College or if he is unable or unwilling to act a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion and (2) a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows" shall be substituted for the words "of which two members at least shall be persons elected by the Warden and Fellows".

That in Clause 3 of the said Statute the words "the Professor or Reader" shall be substituted for the words "every Professor and to the Reader".

Now WE, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.
