The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and female young persons of 16 years of age and over in baking ice wafers on an automatic travelling oven at the Bostock Works of The Variety Wafer Biscuit Company Limited, Bryan Street, Hanley, Stoke-on-Trent, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
