"5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

"(2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act

should be further altered in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1930, and shall have effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of twenty-five per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of twenty-five per cent.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Saviour, Harden, situate within the Parish of Bingley, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

“ Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Bingley and of the District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and District Parish:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Bingley and of the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Saviour, Harden, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Bingley, and with the consent of the Venerable Cecil Wilfred Wilson, of the Vicarage, Bradford, in the said County of York, Clerk in Holy Orders and Archdeacon of Bradford, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the Parish of Bradford, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Bingley and of the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Saviour, Harden, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Harden.’

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Saviour, Harden, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the Parish of Bingley, in the County of York and in the

Diocese of Bradford, which is bounded upon the south east by the New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Cottingley, upon the south partly by the District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton, and partly by the New Parish of Cullingworth, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint James, Cross Roads cum Lees, and partly by the New Parish of Ingrow cum Hainworth, upon part of the north by the New Parish of Eastwood, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Eastwood from the said Parish of Bingley at a point on the western side of Altar Road opposite to its junction with the footpath leading to Fairfax Coppy, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of Altar Road for a distance of 62 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past the houses and premises known as White Cote and Cross Gates to Blind Lane, and extending thence first south eastward and then south westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blind Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Blind Lane for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to the entrance gate to the house and premises known as Saint Ives, and extending thence first south eastward, then southward, and then south westward along the middle of the private road through the grounds attached to Saint Ives house for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Harden Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Harden Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Beck Foot Lane, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Beck Foot Lane for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the eastern side of Beck Foot Mill, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries such footpath across the stream called Harden Beck, upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bingley from the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Cottingley.

“ II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton which is bounded upon the north west and upon the north east by the above described portion of the Parish of Bingley, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bingley from the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton at the point where the stream called Harden Beck is joined by the stream called Mytholme Beck, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Mytholme Beck for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Mytholme Bridge, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the road leading to Harden for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Wilsden, and extending thence first south westward and then southward along the middle of the last men-

tioned road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading past Bents Foot Cottages, and extending thence first westward and then south westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the southern side of Crag Wood and Goitstock Wood, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence which divides Crag Wood from Goitstock Wood, and extending thence northward along the said fence for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Harden Beck and extending thence north westward in a straight line for a distance of 5 yards or thereabouts to the middle of Harden

Beck upon the boundary which divides the said District Parish of Wilsden cum Allerton from the said Parish of Bingley."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Brenchley and Paddock Wood is vested in Sir George Loyd Courthope, Baronet, of Whiligh, Ticehurst, in the said County of Sussex:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of Canterbury and the said Sir George Loyd Courthope have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said three Benefices of Ticehurst, Brenchley and Paddock Wood may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said three Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said three Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Charlton Horethorne and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stowell, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Charlton Horethorne and Stowell duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union (including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Charlton Horethorne and Stowell and the Parish of the Benefice of Abbas Combe otherwise Templecombe in the said County and Diocese), and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Charlton Horethorne and Stowell are now full, the Reverend Christopher Fitz James Carver being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne and the Reverend Thomas Ernest Gatehouse being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stowell:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent, of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne and the said Benefice of Stowell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Charlton Horethorne with Stowell’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices

shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Stowell only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne and the then Incumbent of Stowell shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stowell and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stowell if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne shall have been instituted to Charlton Horethorne subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Stowell and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stowell shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stowell and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith if not previously sold under proper authority shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that out of the net proceeds of such sale a sum sufficient to produce an income of £30 per annum shall be appropriated and held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice and the balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Stowell shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Charlton Horethorne shall have the second and the third turns.

“ 5. That upon the union taking effect all that part of the said Parish of Charlton Horethorne which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Stowell shall be transferred

and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stowell.

"6. That with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, as Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Abbas Combe otherwise Templecombe (which said consent is testified as aforesaid), and with the consent of the Reverend Prebendary Reginald Wynne Windsor, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Abbas Combe otherwise Templecombe (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect a part of the said Parish of Abbas Combe otherwise Templecombe, that is to say, all that portion of such Parish containing an area of three acres or thereabouts with two cottages thereon lying adjacent to the eastern boundary of the said Parish of Stowell and close to the Parish Church of Stowell and Stowell Farm (all which portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stowell.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said

Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Cyril, Bishop of Leicester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cranoe and Slawston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Leicester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Leicester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas by a certain Deed bearing date on or about the 22nd day of May, 1930, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844 and 1856' or some or one of them between the Reverend Reginald Cecil Collwyn Hargreaves, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Springfield, of the first part, Julia Mary Ann Paynter, of Stoke Hill, Guildford, in the County of Surrey, widow, and the Reverend Francis Samuel Paynter, of Blackmore House, Blackmore, in the said County of Essex, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, the Patrons of the said Rectory of Springfield, of the second part, the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of Springfield, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, the said Reginald Cecil Collwyn Hargreaves did, with the consents of the said Julia Mary Ann Paynter and Francis Samuel Paynter, as such Patrons as aforesaid, and of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District or New Parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors one perpetual clear yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of £375 to be payable quarterly on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year free from and clear of all deductions taxes charges rates assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property if any) and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of Springfield and the Tithes or Tithe Commutation Rentcharges, Glebe lands and hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the date of the licence of the first Minister of the said proposed District or New Parish, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the said licence to the said quarterly day of payment:

"And whereas the said perpetual clear yearly rentcharge or net annual sum of £375 has been granted by the said Reginald Cecil Collwyn Hargreaves as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Reginald Cecil Collwyn Hargreaves has nominated to us the Reverend Ernest Augustus Eardley Wilmot, of Carn Brea, Britton Avenue, Saint Albans, in the County of Hertford, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Francis Edward Murphy, of Walcot Rectory, Bath, in the County of Somerset, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the said Cathedral Church of Wells, the Reverend Charles Edward Wilson, of the Vicarage, Gipsy Hill, London, Clerk in

Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend Arthur James Tait, of the Precincts, Peterborough, in the County of Northampton, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, and the Reverend Christopher Maude Chavasse, of Saint Peter's House, Oxford, in the County of Oxford, Clerk in Holy Orders (commonly known and hereinafter referred to as the Simeon Trustees) as the persons to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Springfield which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Springfield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Springfield, shall as from the day last mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same Church as the Parish Church of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Springfield.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Simeon Trustees, their heirs and assigns for ever, as trustees upon the trusts and with the powers and for the purposes of a certain Indenture dated the 28th day of January, 1836.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Springfield, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Springfield, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south east by the Parish of Great Baddow, upon the south and upon the west by the Parish of Chelmsford, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that

is to say, upon the north and upon the north east, by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chelmsford from the said Parish of Springfield at the centre of the viaduct which carries the London and Colchester line of the London and North Eastern Railway across the River Chelmer, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Arbour Lane across such line of railway and extending thence southward along the middle of Arbour Lane for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Springfield Hill, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Springfield Hill for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Sandford Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Sandford Road for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to Barnes Mill, and extending thence first southward, then eastward, and then south eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the gateway at the entrance to Barnes Mill, and extending thence southeastward in a straight line in continuation of the last mentioned road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Chelmer upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Springfield from the said Parish of Great Baddow: Provided always that the territory occupied by the burial ground of the said Parish of Springfield which adjoins the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Springfield, shall be excepted from the said part of the Parish of Springfield and shall not be included in the said proposed New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Springfield."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Springfield out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Samuel Crofts and John Ingram Gough in recognition of their gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 11th September, 1929, two men, Redfern and Hardwick, were filling coal with other men at the Bretby Colliery, South Derbyshire, and were warned to leave their work as a shot was about to be fired near the place where they were working. As they were doing so about 10 tons of roof fell and buried Redfern and Hardwick. Deputy Crofts and others at once tried, at great personal risk, to release the entrapped men. Although further falls were taking place, Crofts remained at work for twenty minutes trying to rescue Redfern until a further large fall of about 100 tons occurred and killed Redfern. Crofts was knocked down and bruised by this fall but he returned to the work of rescue and only gave up the attempt when he had crawled under the fall and had satisfied himself that Redfern was dead.

While Crofts was trying to release Redfern, Gough and others were attempting to free Hardwick. At great personal risk they removed the fallen coal from Hardwick's head and shoulders and placed over his body some covering timber which undoubtedly saved his life when the second large fall occurred.

During these operations the rescuers were several times compelled to take shelter from the falling material, and it was only after two hours work of an exceedingly dangerous nature that they succeeded in rescuing Hardwick alive and in recovering the body of Redfern.

Although all the rescue party showed great bravery and disregard for their own safety Crofts and Gough were recognised by their comrades to have been the most prominent in risking their lives.
