WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of May, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Benhilton, in

the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark :

“ Whereas by a Codicil, dated the 16th day of August, 1927, to the Will, dated the 24th day of December, 1924, of the late Edward Gerald Coles, of Gosden Cottage, Bramley, in the said County of Surrey, Esquire, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Benhilton was devised to the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which such Benefice was situate at the time of his death :

“ And whereas the said Edward Gerald Coles died on the 1st day of May, 1929, and the said Benefice of Benhilton was at that time and still is situate in the same Diocese of Southwark :

“ And whereas the Royal Exchange Assurance Corporation, in the City of London, is the Executor of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested, and the said Corporation is desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Benhilton should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, now Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore

mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Benhilton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Benhilton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Royal Exchange Assurance Corporation (in testimony whereof the said Corporation has sealed this Scheme with its Corporate Seal) and with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Edward Gerald Coles, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Benhilton shall be transferred to the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly

prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 10th day of April, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hawkedon and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stansfield both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hawkedon and Stansfield duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said two Benefices of Hawkedon and Stansfield are at present full, the Reverend Beilby Porteus Oakes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hawkedon and the Reverend Arnold Hill Payne being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stansfield:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Hawkedon and the said Benefice of Stansfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hawkedon and Stansfield' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Hawkedon only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall signify in writing his consent thereto, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not signify his consent as aforesaid, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stansfield and the then Incumbent of Hawkedon shall be the first Incumbent of the United

Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Stansfield only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Hawkedon and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Hawkedon if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Stansfield shall have been instituted to Stansfield subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice and if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall signify in writing his consent thereto, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Stansfield before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not signify his consent as aforesaid, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Stansfield following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Hawkedon and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hawkedon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stansfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and if under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stansfield shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Hawkedon, but otherwise such first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Stansfield.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the two Benefices of Poslingford and Rede both in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Poslingford and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £60 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Rede; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Poslingford and Rede respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Bene-

fices of Poslingford and Rede or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Poslingford and Rede and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant convey and annex to the said Benefices of Poslingford and Rede or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon cease and be no longer payable.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has

made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hampton Lovett and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Elmley Lovett, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Worcester and in the Diocese of Worcester:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report, inter alia, upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hampton Lovett and Elmley Lovett duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices of Hampton Lovett and Elmley Lovett are at present vacant:

“And whereas there is a pension now charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Hampton Lovett in favour of the Reverend Edwin Lewis a former Incumbent of such Benefice:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Ernest, Bishop of Worcester (in

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Hampton Lovett and the said Benefice of Elmley Lovett shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Elmley Lovett with Hampton Lovett’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Droitwich but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

“3. That so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect both the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hampton Lovett and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Elmley Lovett and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith respectively shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sales shall be held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and applied towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice.

“4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Hampton Lovett having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Elmley Lovett having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £25 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of each of the seven Benefices of Dudley, Saint Luke; Feckenham; Kidderminster, Saint John the Baptist; Stourbridge, Saint John; Worcester, Holy Trinity; Worcester, Saint Paul; and Worcester, Saint Peter; all in the said Diocese of Worcester, the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Dudley, Saint Luke; Feckenham; Kidderminster, Saint John the Baptist; Stourbridge, Saint John; Worcester, Holy Trinity; Worcester, Saint Paul; and Worcester, Saint Peter; respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of

any of the said seven Benefices or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said seven Benefices and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those sections apply. Provided that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said seven Benefices or any of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Worcester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable, and provided further that if at the date of the union taking effect the pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Hampton Lovett as aforesaid shall still be payable then the yearly rentcharges of £25 each hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid in favour of the Incumbents of the four said Benefices of Feckenham; Kidderminster, Saint John the Baptist; Stourbridge, Saint John; and Worcester, Saint Peter; shall not become due and payable to the Incumbents of such four Benefices until the date when such pension shall cease to be payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th June, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th June, 1930, to Saturday, the 5th July, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or

a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1883.

THE NEWPORT (SALOP) SCHEME, 1930.

The following Scheme, as settled by the Minister of Health, is published in accordance with the provisions of sections 213 and 214 of, and the 7th schedule to, the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as applied by section 7 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883 :—

Municipal Corporations Act, 1883 :
amending scheme under sections 3 and 7.

NEWPORT (SALOP) URBAN DISTRICT.

Whereas by a scheme dated the 30th day of December, 1885, and made by the Local Government Board under the powers conferred on that Board by sections 3 and 7 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, which said scheme was confirmed by Her Majesty by Order in Council dated the 8th day of March, 1886, certain property belonging to the High Steward Bailiffs and Burgesses of Newport (Salop), including property held for the purposes of their water undertaking was transferred to the Local Board of Newport, Salop, and by article V of that scheme it was provided inter alia that the income arising from that property should, unless the Local Government Board otherwise directed, be applied solely for the maintenance and improvement of the water supply of the district;

And whereas the said property is now vested, subject to the provisions of the said scheme, in the Urban District Council of Newport (Salop);

And whereas the said Urban District Council have applied to the Minister of Health to amend the said scheme in manner hereinafter appearing, and the Minister has caused a local inquiry into such application to be held by one of his officers:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in pursuance of his powers under the Municipal Corporations Act, 1883, hereby orders, as follows:—

1. This scheme may be cited as the Newport (Salop) Scheme, 1930, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1930.

2. In this scheme unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Council” means the Urban District Council of Newport (Salop);

“the district” means the Urban District of Newport (Salop);

“the water undertaking” means the undertaking of the Council for the supply of water as for the time being authorised;

“the scheme of 1885” means the scheme of the Local Government-Board dated the 30th day of December, 1885, referred to in the recitals hereto; and

“statutory securities” means any securities in which trustees are for the time being by or under any Act of Parliament passed or to be passed authorised to invest trust moneys and any mortgages bonds debentures debenture stock stocks or other securities authorised by or under any Act of Parliament passed or to be passed of any county council or municipal corporation or other local authority as defined by section 34 of the Local Loans Act 1875 but does not include annuities rent charges or securities transferable by delivery or any securities of the Council.

3. As from the 1st day of October, 1930, article V of the scheme of 1885 except the proviso to that article shall cease to have effect.

4. All money received by the Council on account of the revenue of the water undertaking shall be carried to and form part of the general rate fund of the district and all payments and expenses made and incurred in respect of the water undertaking shall be paid out of that fund.

5. The Council may if they think fit provide a reserve fund in respect of the water undertaking by setting aside such an amount as they may from time to time think reasonable and investing the same in statutory securities and accumulating the same until the fund so formed amounts to a sum equal to one-tenth of the aggregate amount of capital expenditure on the water undertaking which fund shall be applicable to meet any extraordinary claim or demand at any time arising against the Council in respect of the water undertaking or for payment of the cost of renewing improving or extending any part of the works forming part thereof or otherwise for the benefit of the water undertaking and so that if that fund be at any time reduced it may thereafter be again restored to the prescribed maximum and so from time to time as often as such reduction happens: Provided that resort may be had to the reserve fund under the foregoing provisions although such fund may not at the time have reached or may have been reduced below the prescribed maximum: Provided further that the income of the reserve fund shall be treated as part of the revenue of the water undertaking.

6.—(1) The Council shall keep their accounts in respect of the water undertaking so as to distinguish capital from revenue and as to

revenue so as to show under a separate heading or division on the one side all receipts in respect of the water undertaking and on the other side all payments and expenses in respect of the water undertaking such payments and expenses being divided so as also to show in each case the amounts expended in respect of each of the following purposes (that is to say):—

(a) The working and establishment expenses and cost of maintenance of the water undertaking;

(b) The interest on moneys borrowed by the Council for the purposes of or connected with the water undertaking;

(c) The requisite appropriations instalments or sinking fund payments in respect of moneys borrowed for the purposes of the water undertaking;

(d) All other expenses (if any) of maintaining the water undertaking;

(e) The amount (if any) paid to the reserve fund which the Council are by this order authorised to maintain.

(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in this scheme the Council shall show in their accounts relating to the water undertaking all items (including the payments in respect of loans applicable thereto) which ought to be entered therein in order to show the financial position of the water undertaking.

1. In Article 2 (b) and (c) of the Importation of Raw Cherries Order of 1930 and in the Schedule to that Order there shall be substituted for the words "sixth day of July" wherever they appear the words "twenty-fourth day of June".

Short Title and Construction.

2. This Order may be cited as the Importation of Raw Cherries (Amendment) Order of 1930 and shall be read as one with the Importation of Raw Cherries Order of 1930.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH JUNE, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928.

1.—(1) Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order," is hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Area" and the Area so described shall thereupon become a "Movement Area" for the purposes of the principal Order.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of July, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and thirty.

Restrictions on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, etc., within the Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September (inclusive).

2.—(1) Sheep on any premises in the Area shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, sale-yard or place of exhibition in that Area during the period from 24th July to 9th September (inclusive); in the current year, unless they have within fifty-six days before the date of entry or exposure been double-dipped and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Area from other sheep not so dipped.

(2) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under the direction of the Local Authority, may grant an exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as may be specified therein, exempting sheep in the Area from one or both of the dippings in any particular case in which the Inspector is satisfied that it is

impracticable or inexpedient to dip the sheep. In any such case the reasons for granting the exemption shall be stated therein, and the Local Authority shall forthwith cause a copy of the exemption to be forwarded to the Ministry. If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption.

Special Provision as to Fat Sheep for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any sheep in his district in the Area are intended for immediate slaughter, and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before exposure for sale or exhibition, he may subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence in the Form H described in the First Schedule to the principal Order authorise the movement of the sheep to any market, fairground, sale-yard or place of exhibition in the Area, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence.

(2) Such conditions may, if the Local Authority think fit, be varied so as to enable any sheep, which are returned unsold from a market in the Area with a licence (Form H) to any premises, to be moved to another market, fairground, or saleyard without the sheep being previously double-dipped.

Interpretation.

4. The expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as in the principal Order.

Offences.

5. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

18. To make provisions as to the rights, privileges and liabilities of the holders of mortgages and debenture stock of the Company and prescribing the minimum holdings of stock and debenture stock of the Company.

19. To repeal sections 29 to 33 of the Cheltenham Gas Act 1872 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1872") and to make new provisions as to the sale of consolidated ordinary stock and preference shares or stock in the capital of the Company by auction or tender.

20. To empower the directors of the Company to reserve a proportion of any future issue of capital for exclusive offer to consumers of gas and to the employees of the Company and to make provisions as to the conditions of issue.

21. To empower the directors of the Company with the consent of the Board of Trade to offer capital for subscription by the holders of ordinary or preference shares or stocks or debenture stock of the Company and by consumers of gas and employees of the Company without first offering the same for sale by public auction or tender.

22. To empower the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable preference shares or stock and debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of such stock either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference shares or stock or debenture stock after redemption.

23. To make further provision with reference to the Company's affairs including provisions to relieve the Company of any obligation to see to the execution of trusts to which their shares or stock or debenture stock may be subject, as to the holding of annual meetings, the notices of meetings, the appointment of proxies, joint holders, the manner of voting at meetings, voting rights, the qualification of directors, the closing of transfer books, directors holding office under or contracting with the Company and notice of candidature of or of opposition to re-election of directors.

24. To make new provisions with respect to the payment of interim dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and as to the preparation of the Company's accounts and to repeal sections 25 and 26 of the Act of 1872.
