And next after our sincerest Praises to the Almighty, the first Cause and Author of them, we beg Leave to return our humble Thanks to Your Majesty, the Glorious Instrument in procuring them by Your unparalleled Conduct, Toils and Dangers: And to Evidence the Reality of our Gratitude both to GOD and Your Majesty, we take the humble Confidence to assure You, SIR, that we will in our respective Places and Stations Express our Duty and Loyalty to Your Majesty, our Undoubted Lawful and Rightful Sovereign, and we will also use all our Legal Endeavours to suppress, Punish, and Discourage all Immorality, Debauchery and Profaneness whatsoever, as being the best Means to obtain the Favour of GOD, in the Prosperity of Your Majesties Person and Government, which we most heartily Pray for.

Genoa, Jan. 12. N. S. The 9th Instant Sir Lambert Blackwell, His Majesty of Great-Britain's Envoy Extraordinary, gave notice to the Senate of his arrival here, upon which they deputed 4 of the Nobility to Compliment him, and appointed the manner of his Reception; On Thursday next He is to have a private Conference with the Doge, and in few days after his Publick Audience.

Venice, Jan. 17. The Earl of Manchester is preparing for his Publick Entry; The French Ambassador made his Excellency a private Visit yesterday, and the like is expected from the Ambassador of Spain, who in the mean time has sent to Compliment him. General Richards is arrived here from the Maree.

Lisbon, Jan. 6. The Cortes which are assembled here have resolved to give the King of Portugal a Supply of 600000 Crusadoes per Annum towards maintaining the Sea and Land Forces, which is to be raised on Sugar, Tobacco, Salt and Paper, consumed within the Kingdom. The first, second and third days of this month Mr. Methuen, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of England, at this Court, made Publick Rejoycings, and gave very splendid Entertainments, with Fireworks, &c. for the Conclusion of the Peace.

Cadix, Dec. 23. The 6th Instant 4 English Merchantmen bound to Turkey failed hence in Company of some other Ships bound up the Streights. The 18th the St. Charles, a new Spanish Man of War of 84 Guns, and 800 Men, coming from Naples, richly laden, to the value of Two Millions of Pieces of Eight, struck upon a Rock about Five Leagues from this place, and was lost with about 150 of her Men. The 23d an Advice Boat arrived here from the Havana in 53 days, with an account, that the Galeons failed from thence the first of September, but after having been 4 or 5 days at Sea, they met with a Storm, in which the Admiral and 2 other Ships proving very Leaky, they were forced to return to the Havana

to refit, so that they are not now expected home before April or May next. The Moores are still before Ceuta, but so discouraged with their ill success, that we expect every day to hear they have raised the Siege.

Madrid, Jan. 8. The Prince of Hesse-Darmstadt goes about the latter end of this month to take possession of his Government of Catalonia. The Marquis de Cremona is made General of the Artillery of Sardinia; and the Conde de la Corzana, Commissary General of Horse and Foot throughout the Kingdom of Spain. The Count de Laguasque, Envoy from the King of Poland, had this day Audience of his Catholick Majesty. Signior Montenegro, Ambassador from the Republick of Venice, is arrived here, and the Sieur Pietro Venter, his Predecessor, having taken Leave of their Majesties, is disposing all things for his departure. We have an account, that two Gallies of the Squadron of Sicily are cast away, with most of their Men, going towards Port-Mahon. Our Advices from Malaga bring an account, that on the 21th past arrived there the Portland Man of War, Cap. Littleton Commander, with 5 Sail of English Merchant Ships from Newfoundland; who failed again the 23d for Alicante and Barcelona.

Warsaw, Jan. 14. The King of Poland having in his Journey from Cracow been very splendidly Entertained at the Houses of divers Persons of Quality, arrived last Friday at Gura, about 5 Leagues from this City, where he stayed till all things were put in order for his Entry. On the 12th Instant his Majesty parted from thence early in the morning, about 9 arrived at Vilanova, and after a Noble Entertainment given him by the Queen Dowager, his Majesty, accompanied by the two Princes Alexander and Constantin, Sons of the late King, came to Czernice, 4 miles distant from this place, where he was met by the Great Officers of the Crown, by the Senate, and generally by all Persons of Note that were in Town, among whom was the Bishop of Plesko, at the head of a Party that had formerly sided with the Prince of Conti, who now strove to outdo the rest in Demonstrations of Duty to his Majesty; The King being come to the Triumphal Arch raised near the City Gate, was Complimented by our Magistrates, who presented to him the Keys of the City; His Majesty went directly to the Cathedral, and was there received by the Clergy; and Mass being sung, with a triple discharge of the Artillery, his Majesty repaired to the Castle, where he was Complimented by the Palatine of Plesko our Governour, and in the Evening made a Visit to the Queen Dowager, who was returned from Vilanova. Frequent Consultations are held here concerning the raising of Money to pay off the Lithuanian Forces, and settling the Affairs of the Kingdom; The Cardinal Primare hitherto continues obstinate, in rejecting the Proposals made to him; But he and the Palatine of Kyovia are the only two considerable Persons that have not yet made their submission to his Majesty. The Northern Crowns have, by their Ministers here, given the King fresh Assurances of their Friendship and desire of continuing in good Correspondency with him. There is no time yet fixed for the meeting of the General Diet. Our Advices from the Frontier bring an account, that the Tartars are preparing to carry to Caminiec the Provisions they have brought together at Jas, for which the Frost gives them an opportunity, by rendering the Ways more passable, which being done, is apprehended they will make an inroad into Poland; and Orders are therefore sent to our Forces on the Frontiers to have a watchful Eye on their Motions.

Dantzick, Jan. 26. Letters from Warsaw of the 21th give an account, that fresh Endeavours were used by the Bishop of Raab and Palatin of Culm, to bring over the Primate to the Kings Interest, and that they were to that end gone to Lowitz, where he still resides, having some reason to believe that they should find him in a better disposition to accommodate Matters, than he shewed at the last meeting some Persons of Quality had with him for that purpose. The King's Journey to Prussia is fixed for the 28th of this month. The Differences continue in Lithuania between the Families of Sapieha and Oginsky, and being grown to such a height that open Hostilities pass between them, occasion much disorder in that Country.

Vienna, Jan. 18. The Count of Harrach, the Emperor's Ambassador to the King of Spain, is gone hence, and takes his Journey through France. The States of the Lower-Austria are assembled; and have already entered upon the Consideration of a Supply for the next year. We hear from the Frontiers, that some Troops of Turks and Rebels were marched from Belgrade towards Temeswar, intending to pass the Tebiske, and make an Incurtion in those parts, but the Thaw happening prevented their design.
