The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of May, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Highampton and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheepwash, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter :

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Highampton and Sheepwash duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Sheepwash and the

Parish of the Benefice of Black Torrington situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report :

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report :

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Highampton and Sheepwash are now full, the Reverend Ellice Wimond Hart Paine being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Highampton and the Reverend Arthur Moore Wylie being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheepwash :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Highampton and the said Benefice of Sheepwash shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Highampton with Sheepwash ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Barnstaple and of the Rural Deanery of Torrington but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this

Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Highampton and Sheepwash shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

" 4. That with the consent of Arthur Gardiner, of Snail Creep, Houghton, Stockbridge, in the County of Southampton, Esquire (testified by his signing this Scheme), as Patron of the said Benefice of Black Torrington and with the consent of the Reverend Thomas Buncombe now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Black Torrington (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that detached portion of the said Parish of Black Torrington which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Highampton shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Sheepwash.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable

to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Farnborough and the said Benefice of West Ilsley shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of West Ilsley with Farnborough' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Wantage but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

the said Benefice of West Ilsley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Farnborough and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Farnborough shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of West Ilsley shall have the second turn.

RAWTENSTALL CORPORATION TRAMWAYS AND MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Byelaws and Regulations have been made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Rawtenstall, acting by the Town Council as promoters of the Rawtenstall Corporation Tramways and Omnibus Undertakings under and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Rawtenstall Corporation Act, 1924, and Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and of every other power them thereunto enabling as to nuisances and as to travelling on Tramcars and Omnibuses.

Interpretation.

1. Throughout these byelaws and regulations the word "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Rawtenstall, and such other local authority as may for the time being use the Tramways of the Corporation; the word "carriage" means any tramcar or omnibus run by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers; the word "conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a carriage and the word "driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a carriage. The expression "Interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

Extent of Byelaws and Regulations.

2. The Byelaws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws and Regulations.

Entering or Leaving Carriages.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform and not otherwise, unless so directed by the conductor. When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

Entering or Leaving a Carriage in Motion.

4. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any carriage in motion.

Smoking or Spitting.

5. No passenger shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in the interior of any carriage, except in a portion or compartment specially set apart for the purpose. No person shall spit in, on, from or against any carriage.

Musical Instruments.

6. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any carriage.

Obscene or Offensive Language, Etc.

7. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage, tramway station, waiting room or premises used in connection with the tramway or omnibus system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Intoxicated Persons.

8. A person who is in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, shall not enter or mount upon any carriage and if found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately upon being requested to do so by the conductor.

Damage to Carriages.

9. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage, any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws and Regulations in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Objectionable Persons.

10. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the seats, linings, or cushions of any carriage, or the dress or clothing of any

passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor might, for any other reason, be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid being returned provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on any carriage under the provisions of this Byelaw on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares.

11. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other fully authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey and obtain a ticket therefor. No child under 3 years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare.

Tickets.

12. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when requested to do so, to the conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, and shall also, when required so to do by the conductor or any duly authorised officer of the Corporation, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger. Except as otherwise provided for in these Byelaws and Regulations tickets shall not be transferable, and any person leaving a carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any carriage or on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey, or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions upon which it is issued.

Artisans.

13. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, or travel or attempt to travel as an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer.

Luggage.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers), shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not elsewhere.

Travelling on Steps, Etc.

15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, or sit on the railing, guards or buffers of any carriage, and any person so travelling, standing or sitting shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

Seating of Passengers.

16. No person except a passenger or intending passenger shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on to any part of any carriage or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the conductor.

Full Number of Passengers.

17. When any carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers according to the notice thereof attached to the carriage no person beyond such number shall enter, mount, or remain therein, when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Dogs.

18. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, Etc.

19. No person shall enter, mount or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

20. No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Corporation, and no person other than the conductor or driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, trolley cord or any other part of a carriage or its equipment, or signal a carriage to start, or without reasonable cause signal a carriage to stop.

Disabled Carriages.

21. If at any time a carriage becomes disabled or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same and, if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to

travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

Power to Remove Passengers Committing Offence.

22. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Byelaws and Regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the conductor, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Enforcing Byelaws.

23. Every conductor and driver of a carriage shall enforce these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent a breach thereof to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

24. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Byelaws to be placed in Carriages.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use and in or about each tramway station, waiting room or premises a printed copy of these Byelaws and Regulations.

Date Byelaws and Regulations come into Force.

26. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of October, 1930.

Repeal of Existing Byelaws.

27. From and after the date of these Byelaws and Regulations coming into force the Byelaws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Rawtenstall, acting by the Town Council as the Promoters of the Rawtenstall Corporation Tramways Undertaking, on the 21st day of October, 1909, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as to Nuisances, and as to travelling on Trams, shall be repealed without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.
