SCHEDULE.

1. The wages payable for the employment of male workers on harvest work during the period of the Corn Harvest in 1930 shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

2. In the case of a whole-time male worker of 14 years of age or over who is employed on harvest work on a farm during the whole period of harvest on that farm, the period of such harvest shall be deemed to be 24 working days (not necessarily consecutive working days), and in the event of the harvest being completed in less than 24 days, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the number of days worked had been 24.

3. The rates of wages payable for employment of male workers on harvest work during the said period (a) on Sundays, (b) in excess of 64 hours in any week (excluding Sunday), shall be not less than the following minimum rates:—

5. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times.

6. Any existing rate or Order so far as the same is inconsistent with this Order is hereby superseded.

7. This Order shall apply to the Corn Harvest in 1930 only.

AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Essex which for the purposes of the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, shall be deemed to include the county boroughs of East Ham, Southend-on-Sea, and West Ham and those parts of the Metropolitan borough of Woolwich in the administrative county of London which lie north of the River Thames have, in pursuance of the above Act duly fixed minimum rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work during the period of the Corn Harvest in 1930 on the premises on which the worker is employed and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective during the Corn Harvest in 1930.

SCHEDULE.

1. Male Workers.

(a) Farms of over 60 acres of corn.

(i) The rate of wages payable for the employment of all male workers on the Corn Harvest on farms comprising more than 60 acres of corn on the premises on which the worker is employed, shall be not less than the minimum rates of wages applicable to a worker of his age under the Orders of the Agricultural Wages Board for the time being in force and such worker shall in addition be entitled (as part of his wages) and in lieu of the overtime rates of wages otherwise applicable, on the completion of the harvest, to the sum mentioned in the following table provided that such worker has worked on the premises throughout the period of the harvest on harvest work for such hours (excluding Sunday) as the employer may require and that the hours so required to be worked shall not exceed 11 in any day.
