# Civil Service Commission, July 22, 1930.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE TELEGRAPHIST IN LONDON IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 17. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the examination

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as conationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a

natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

- 3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- 4. At each examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.
- 5. The examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—
  - 1. English.
  - 2. History.
  - 3. Geography.
    - 4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole,

- 6. The Examination is open only to local candidates. A local candidate is regarded as one whose family home is situated where she can travel to and from the office conveniently and without detriment to her health or the interests of the Department. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.
- 7. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.
- 8. In view of the difficulty which left-handed operators are likely to experience in the use of instruments designed for right-handed operators, candidates who are markedly left-handed are ineligible for appointment.
- 9. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.
- 10. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 11. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 12. A fee of 10s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, on the 28th October, 1930.

Appointments will be offered to not fewer than 100 of the candidates highest on the list, provided they obtain the necessary aggregate of marks, qualify in writing, and are duly qualified in other respects.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 17th September, 1930, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

# THE ROADS ACT, 1920. COUNTY OF NORFOLK.

Notice is hereby given that on the 15th day of July, 1930, the Minister of Transport made an Order under Section 7 (4) of the Roads Act. 1920, in respect of a certain highway in the County of Norfolk.

The Order will come into force on the 4th day of August, 1930, and is to the following effect:—

I. During the period of five years from the date on which the Order comes into force,

no person shall, save as hereinafter provided, drive or cause to be driven on the highway specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said highway") any locomotive, any heavy motor car (as defined by Article II of the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904), or any motor car with seats for more than fourteen persons exclusive of the driver;

- II. Nothing in the Order contained shall prevent the driving on the said highway of ...
  - (i) Any vehicle which is being used for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjoining or lying near to the said highway or for the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;
  - (ii) Any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said highway; or
  - (iii) Any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said highway, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said highway of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.
