IT is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council that the Lord President of the Council, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the Secretary of State for Scotland, and the President of the Board of Education, respectively, for the time being, be, and they are, hereby appointed a Committee of the Privy Council for the organisation and development of agricultural research.

And it is ordered that during His Majesty's pleasure the Lord President of the Council shall be the Chairman and the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries Vice-Chairman of the said Committee.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the

Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 107, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation bearing date the 19th day of June, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 107, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Kirby Muxloe, in the Parish of Glenfield, in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:
