At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 28th day of July, 1930.

### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of June, 1930 (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :-

"Whereas by Section 4 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1869, it is enacted that the Admiralty may, under regulations to be from time to time made by them, send any non-commissioned officers or men of the Royal Navy and Marines admitted to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital, to a Hospital or Infirmary, to be there maintained at the expense of Greenwich Hospital:

"And whereas by Her late Majesty's Order in Council dated the 25th day of January, 1887, the payment to be made from the funds of Greenwich Hospital for each non-commissioned officer or man so maintained in Naval Hospitals or Infirmaries was fixed at 2s. 6d.

a day:

"And whereas we are of opinion that this increased:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that

Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment to be made from the funds of Greenwich Hospital being at the increased rate of 10s. a 65-33633

day as from the 1st April, 1930, for each noncommissioned or petty officer, leading rating or man so maintained in Naval Hospitals or Infirmaries."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
