Genous, January 26. Madrid, Jan. 22. The French have evacuated Barcilons, and all the other Places in Catalonia, which they were to restore according to the late Treaty of Peace. The 20th Instant there was a Review in the presence of their Catholick Majesties of 500 new raised Horse, which will be formed into a Regiment under the Command of the Prince of Hesse Darmstadt, who intends to go hence in a day or two to his Government of Catalonia.
