And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 31st day of July, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Erdington, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes, situate as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Erdington which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan

hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes.’

“And with the like consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Saint Mary, Pype Hayes, being:—

“All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Erdington, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham, which is bounded upon the north east by the New Parish of Walmley, upon the east by the Parish of Curdworth, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Margaret, Castle Bromwich, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north west, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of Bromford Bridge which carries Bromford Lane across the River Tame where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Margaret, Castle Bromwich, of the New Parish of Saint Margaret, Ward End, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of Erdington all meet, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Bromford Lane for a distance of 74 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Kingsbury Road, and extending thence first north eastward and then eastward along the middle of Kingsbury Road for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Holly Lane, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of Holly Lane for a distance of 60 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Grange Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Grange Road for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chester Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Chester Road for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence forming the north western boundary of the grounds attached to the house known as Pype Hayes Hall, and extending thence north eastward to and along such fence for a distance of 18½ chains or thereabouts to the right bank of Plants Brook and continuing thence north eastward to a point in the middle of Plants
