**P**URSUANT to Section 5 of the County Courts Act, 1903, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Schedule to the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, shall be amended as follows:—

In Circuit 38, (a) Circuit No. 38 is removed from the first column of the said Schedule; (b) Romford is removed from the second column thereof; and (c) Grays Thurrock is removed from the third column thereof.

2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1930, and shall come into operation on the first day of January, 1931, and the County Courts Order in Council, 1924, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order, as amended, should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be added to Article 1 of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921 (as amended):—

“(xxx) It shall be lawful for the Clearing Office or the Administrator to deduct from any sum payable by the Clearing Office or Administrator to a creditor, or any other person, such commission not exceeding 2½ per cent. of the total amount paid or payable, as may be fixed by the Clearing Office or Administrator.”

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) (Amendment) Order, 1930, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1924, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1930.

**W**HEREAS by section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may by

Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State:

And whereas by Section 25, sub-section (1) of the Copyright Act, 1911, it is enacted that the said Act, except such of the provisions thereof as are expressly restricted to the United Kingdom, shall extend throughout His Majesty's Dominions: Provided that it shall not extend to a self-governing dominion unless declared by the Legislature of that dominion to be in force therein either without any modifications or additions or with such modifications and additions relating exclusively to procedure and remedies, or necessary to adapt the said Act to the circumstances of the dominion as may be enacted by such Legislature:

And whereas by Section 35 sub-section (1) of the said Act it is also enacted that “Self-governing dominion” means the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, and Newfoundland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Irish Free State shall be deemed to be a self-governing dominion for the purposes of the Copyright Act, 1911, as though in Section 35 thereof the Irish Free State were included between the Union of South Africa and Newfoundland.

**W**HEREAS by Section 26, subsection (3) of the Copyright Act, 1911, it is provided that if His Majesty in Council is satisfied that the law of a self-governing Dominion to which the said Act does not extend provides adequate protection within the Dominion for the works (whether published or unpublished) of authors who at the time of the making of the work were British subjects resident elsewhere than in that Dominion, His Majesty in Council may, for the purpose of giving reciprocal protection, direct that the said Act, except such parts (if any) thereof as may be specified in the Order and subject to any conditions contained therein, shall, within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends, apply to works the authors whereof were, at the time of the making of the work, resident within the first-mentioned Dominion, and to works first published in that Dominion:

And whereas by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 27th day of *October*, 1930, it is provided that the Irish Free State is to be
