

shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said townships now part of the Parish of Bothal and proposed to be annexed to the Parish of Longhirst, and the fees for marriages, churchings and burials and other ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments arising from the said townships shall thenceforth belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Longhirst.

"That the Patronage or right of nomination of a minister to serve the enlarged Parish of Longhirst shall remain vested in the present Patron of Longhirst.

"That the curate's house at Priestbridge situate in the said Township of Tritlington do remain as part of the property of the said Benefice of Bothal.

"That the endowment particulars of which are entered in the second Schedule hereto shall from and after the date of the Scheme taking effect be separated from the endowment of the said Parish of Bothal and shall belong to and become part of the endowment for the Minister of the said proposed enlarged Parish of Longhirst.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage of the said Parish of Bothal.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE above referred to.

"All those portions of the Parish of Bothal in the County of Northumberland and Diocese of Newcastle, comprised within the Townships or Civil Parishes of Causey Park, Earsdon Forest, Earsdon, Tritlington, Fenrother, Cockle Park and Hebburn, which form the Chapelry of St. Cuthbert, Hebburn, together with the Township or Civil Parish of Old Moor, the boundaries of which townships and Chapelry are well known and defined.
