Four Hackney Carriages:

On the North side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the passage between Nos. 4 and 5, Pembridge Square and extending Eastward, by kerb of garden enclosure, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
