TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 28th November, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st December, 1930, to Saturday, the 6th December, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Where a whole-time male worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker in respect of that week, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker in respect of that week.

3. For the purpose of the above minimum rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

4. For the purpose of the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

(f)—(i) In the case of a worker who is given a clear day's holiday in the week commencing on 5th April, 1931, and terminating on 11th April, 1931, all employment in that week in excess of 41½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment).

(ii) In any other case, all employment in excess of 41½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the week commencing on 29th March, 1931, and terminating on 4th April, 1931.

(g) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any week in winter, except as provided in Clause (e) above.

(h) All employment in excess of 51 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any week in summer, except as provided in Clause (f) above.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the first Sunday in November, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

This Order shall come into operation on 21st December, 1930, and shall continue in operation until 19th December, 1931.

(Constitution of Commissioners; Transfer of powers of Trustees; Maintenance and improvement of pier and harbour undertaking; Regulation and use of pier and harbour and buildings thereon; Tolls, rates and charges; Power to sell and lease; Borrowing and other financial provisions; Byelaws; Incorporation, repeal and amendment of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made on or before the 23rd day of December next, to the Minister of Transport by the Trustees of the Yarmouth (Isle of Wight) Town Trust (hereinafter referred to as "the Trustees") for a Provisional Order pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 and the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act for the following purposes or some of them (that is to say):—

1. To constitute a body of Commissioners by the name of "The Yarmouth (Isle of Wight) Harbour Commissioners" (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") and to prescribe the persons bodies or interests by whom and the manner in which the Commissioners shall be appointed or elected.

2. To provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Commissioners of all the property rights and interests of the Trustees in the harbour and quay and pier of Yarmouth and to repeal the Yarmouth (Isle of Wight) Pier Order 1874 and so much of the Yar Bridge Act 1858 as affects the undertaking so to be transferred.

3. To define the limits within which the Commissioners shall have authority and the rates which may be levied by the Commissioners.

4. To authorise the Commissioners to purchase by agreement and hold and to sell or otherwise dispose of lands and hereditaments for the purposes of their undertaking.

5. To empower the Commissioners to maintain their undertaking and to construct maintain alter and improve all necessary jetties, landing places, approaches, steps, buildings, buoys, moorings and other works, apparatus and conveniences.

6. To authorise the Commissioners to deepen, dredge, scour and excavate for the purposes of the Order, the foreshore and bed of the sea and to appropriate any sand, mud and other materials excavated and to acquire dredgers for such purposes.

7. To empower the Commissioners to levy rates and charges in connection with their undertaking, to confer vary or extinguish exemptions from payment thereof, to compound with respect thereto, to issue pass or family tickets on such terms as may be prescribed by the Order and to make provision for revision of such rates and charges.

8. To empower the Commissioners to close the pier on special occasions, to make such special and increased charges on those occasions as they may think fit to provide for or contribute to the provision of entertainments

and to enable the Commissioners to restrict the use which may be made of the harbour pier and quay for mooring and for landing goods.

9. To enable the Commissioners to sell or lease their undertaking or any part thereof with the approval of the Minister of Transport in such manner as may be provided by the intended Order.

10. To authorise the Commissioners to make vary or rescind byelaws rules and regulations for the management regulation and use of the harbour pier and quay and the conduct of persons using the same and to impose penalties for the breach or non-observance of such byelaws rules or regulations and to provide for the enforcement thereof.

11. To authorise the Commissioners to borrow money for all or any of the purposes of the Order and to charge the moneys so to be borrowed and the interest thereon upon the revenue of the undertaking and to provide for the repayment of the said moneys and for the payment of any deficiency in the said revenue out of such rates revenues or funds as the Order may prescribe and to form and maintain a reserve fund.

12. To incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847 and any amendment or modification of the said Acts.
