STROUD GAS LIGHT AND COKE  
COMPANY.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Stroud Gas Light and Coke Company (of Stroud in the County of Gloucester) intend to apply to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. V. c. 28). The objects of the Application and Order are:—

1. To sanction and confirm an Agreement dated the 29th day of October, 1930, for the acquisition by the Company of the undertaking of the Painswick Gas Company hitherto carried on by Clarke Jeffery at Painswick in the County of Gloucester and to vest such undertaking in the Company.

2. To create and empower the Company to issue to the said Clarke Jeffery or his nominee or nominees as part of the consideration for the said transfer £2000 Consolidated Ordinary Stock of the Company, such stock to be deemed to be fully paid up and rank in all respects *pari passu* with and to confer all the like rights of voting and otherwise and the like powers and privileges as are conferred by or attach to the existing Consolidated Ordinary Stock.

3. To authorise the Company to maintain and erect gas works with all necessary machinery and apparatus for making and storing gas and working up and converting residual products upon land in the Parish of Painswick in the rural district of Stroud in the County of Gloucester being the site of the existing Gas Works of Clarke Jeffery being the whole of enclosure numbered 789 on the  $\frac{1}{25000}$  Ordnance Map (Gloucestershire) Sheet XLI. 8 (Edition 1923) and containing 1 rood 4 perches.

4. To empower the Company for a period of ten years from the date of the Order to charge a differential price not exceeding sixpence per therm above the price charged to consumers of gas now supplied by the Company for all gas supplied in the Parish of Pitchcombe and so much of the Parish of Painswick as lies to the north of a line drawn due east and west through the south west corner of Slad Church.

Any local or other public Authority Company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 8th day of February, 1931.

Any such objection shall state:

- (a) the specific grounds of objection;
- (b) the omissions additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the Objection shall be forwarded to the Applicants for the Order or their

Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS

SAINT THOMAS RURAL ELECTRICITY SPECIAL  
ORDER 1931.

(This Order is part of the Exe Valley Electricity (Extension) Special Order which was originally applied for and was divided into two parts by the Electricity Commissioners.)

**N**OTICE is hereby given that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts, a Special Order made by them to be granted to the Exe Valley Electricity Company Limited for the supply by the Teignmouth Electric Lighting Company Limited of electricity within part of the Rural District of Saint Thomas in the County of Devon.

The Minister of Transport proposes to confirm the Order and gives notice that any person affected who may be desirous of objecting to the confirmation of the same must in accordance with the Electricity (Confirmation of Special Orders) Rules, 1921, do so by memorial addressed to the Minister of Transport written on one side only of foolscap paper and sent by registered post addressed to The Secretary, Ministry of Transport, 6, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, and posted not later than the 31st day of January, 1931. A copy of any such memorial must also be sent in like manner to Messrs. Sherwood and Company, 22, Abingdon Street, Westminster, London, S.W. 1, Parliamentary Agents for the Order. Such memorial must be sealed or signed by the person objecting or by some responsible and duly authorised person on his behalf and must state the specific grounds of objection to the Order and the modifications desired.

A copy of the Order as submitted for confirmation has been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Devon at his office at Exeter and with the Clerks to the Rural District Councils of Crediton, St. Thomas and Torrington at their respective offices.
