TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th February, 1931, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th February, 1931, to Saturday, the 21st February, 1931, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash (r a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Bedfordshire Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

MOTOR OMNIBUSES.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Byelaws have been made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Haslingden, acting by the Town Council as owners of omnibuses under the powers conferred on them by the Haslingden Corporation Act, 1929, and Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and of every other power them thereunto enabling.

Extent of Byelaws.

1. The Byelaws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all omnibuses of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Byelaws.

Interpretation.

- 2. Throughout these Byelaws, the following words shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—
 - "Omnibus" means any omnibus run by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers.

"Driver" means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an omnibus.

"Conductor" means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of an omnibus.

"Interior of an omnibus" shall not include the upper deck of a double-deck omnibus.

Entering or Leaving Omnibus.

- 3. No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any omnibus in motion.
- 4. When an omnibus stops, no person shall board the omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.
- 5. No person, except a passenger, or intending passenger shall enter or mount any omnibus.

Musical Instruments.

6. No passenger of other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

Smoking or Spitting.

- 7. No person shall contrary to the provisions of any notice exhibited in an omnibus smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in the interior of any omnibus.
- interior of any omnibus.

 8. No person shall spit in or on, from or against any omnibus.

Begging, Collecting, etc.

9. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus distribute advertisements or tracts of any kind or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any omnibus.

Intoxicated Persons.

10. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any omnibus, and if found in or upon any omnibus shall leave the omnibus immediately on being requested to do so by the conductor.

Offensive Language.

11. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Nuisances.

12. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's omnibuses.

Wilful Damage.

13. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the seats, cushions, linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any omnibus, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this Byelaw shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Byelaws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Offensive Clothing.

14.-A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any omnibus and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any omnibus, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the same, upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus under the provisions of this byelaw, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares. .

15.—Each passenger shall immediately upon demand, and in case no demand shall have been made, before leaving the omnibus, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall not (except as expressly provided for by these Byelaws) be transferable, and shall be (except as aforesaid) available only for the journey and on the omnibus for and on which the same is issued, except in the case of a special return or transfer ticket, and subject to these exceptions any passenger leaving an omnibus shall be deemed to have completed his journey. No child under 3 years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare.

Tickets.

16.—Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when requested so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

17.—No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible. No

passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any omnibus or on any day for which such ticket is not available, or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey, or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions upon which it is issued.

18.—A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, or mechanics or daily labourers.

Standing on Steps, Etc.

19.—No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation, in the execution of his duties, shall travel on the steps or platform of any omnibus, or stand on the upper deck, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease so to do immediately on request by the conductor.

20.—No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus, or travel, therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

Full Number of Passengers.

21.—When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain according to the notice thereof attached to the omnibus no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such omnibus when warned by the conductor not to do so.

Dogs.

22.—No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any omnibus, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this Byelaw shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Firearms, Etc.

23.—No person shall enter, mount or travel in or on any omnibus with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may in the opinion of the conductor be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Obstructing Driver or Conductor.

24.—No passenger or other person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus of the Corporation and no person other than the Conductor or Driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights, ventilators, or any other part of an omnibus or its equipment.

Damaged Omnibus.

25. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any

cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus so far as its carrying capacity permits, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

Bells.

26. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any omnibus, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any omnibus, nor signal an omnibus to start.

Power to Remove Offending Passengers.

27. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any omnibus, any breach of these Byelaws, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and, if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Shelters.

28. No persons other than intending passengers and servants of the Corporation shall enter any shelter or waiting-room provided for the accommodation of intending passengers and servants of the Corporation.

Enforcement.

29. Every conductor and driver of an omnibus shall enforce these Byelaws and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.

Penalty.

30. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

Byelaws to be placed in Omnibuses.

31. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use and in or about each omnibus station or waiting room a printed copy of these Byelaws.

Date of Commencement.

32. These Byelaws shall come into force on the first day of May, 1931.
