FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Bedfordshire Foot-and-Mouth
Disease Infected Area.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 4) shall be read and have effect as if the Area described in the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

#### Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of February, nineteen hundred and thirty-one.

## Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 5).
