"And whereas under the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924, provision was made subject to certain conditions and restrictions for the increase of certain pensions granted before the 4th day of August, 1914, and, subject to certain further limitations, for the increase of similar pensions granted subsequently to that date to certain pensioners therein referred to:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of August, 1920, the 8th day of December, 1924, and the 25th day of June, 1925, to sanction certain Regulations regarding the increase of pensions to certain pensioners therein specified under conditions corresponding generally to those laid down in the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas by Your Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of December, 1929, sanction was given to the amendment of the aforesaid Regulations so as to provide for the recognition for Pensions Increase purposes of children adopted under the provisions of the Adoption of Children Act, 1926:

"And whereas we consider that all children, who may be statutorily adopted under the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930, or under any like Act which may hereafter be passed in, and be applicable to, any other part of the British Empire, should also be recognised for Pensions Increase purposes:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the further amendment of the aforesaid Regulations accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"And whereas, by the terms of the said Schedule, compassionate allowances may only be granted to the legitimate children under the age of 16 of a deceased Seaman or Marine whose widow herself is awarded a pension under the Regulations or would, if she had been living at the time of the Seaman's or Marine's death, have been eligible for such pension:

"And whereas we are of opinion that, in exceptional circumstances, compassionate allowances should be granted to such children even though the widow herself is ineligible for the award of a pension under the Regulations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to empower us at our discretion to make such awards.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bury, situate in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, for the alternate Patronage of the United Benefice (being a Rectory) of Coln Rogers with Coln Saint Denis, situate in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Gloucester :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bury is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Gloucester (hereinafter called ‘ the said Dean and Chapter ’):

“ And whereas one moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Coln Rogers with Coln Saint Denis is vested in the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called ‘ the said Master, Fellows and Scholars ’):

“ And whereas the remaining moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Coln Rogers with Coln Saint Denis is already vested in the said Dean and Chapter :

“ And whereas the said Dean and Chapter and the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars, have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said Benefice of Bury and of the said United Benefice of Coln Rogers with Coln Saint Denis may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed :

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and

of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Master, Fellows and Scholars (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bury and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Pembroke College in the University of Oxford, and that in exchange for the same the said moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Coln Rogers with Coln Saint Denis and the Churches thereof which is now vested in the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars as aforesaid shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Master, Fellows and Scholars and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Chichester and Gloucester.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, and Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, and the Parish of the Benefice of Holborn, Saint John the Evangelist, situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, and Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, is now full, the Reverend Alfred Milnthorpe Fergusson being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, is at present vacant:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Alfred Milnthorpe Fergusson (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, and the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr with Holy Trinity’ and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“2. That the Church of the Parish of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“3. That in the event of the services of the organist or any of the Church Servants of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such organist or Church Servants shall, out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of Clause 9 of this Scheme, receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“4. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred Milnthorpe Fergusson if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“5. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, Holborn, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“6. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually

occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be added to the aggregate fund hereinafter mentioned.

"7. That two Curates be employed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice, and upon the union taking effect the grant of £120 per annum hitherto payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, conditionally upon the employment of a Curate within the Parish of that Benefice shall become payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of two Curates within the United Parish.

"8. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square.

"9.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall together with the net proceeds of the sale as aforesaid of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, form one aggregate fund which shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations mentioned in Clause 3 of this Scheme or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations as in the same Clause is provided and (2) for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection and endowment (including the provision therefor of a Parsonage House) of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built such Church and District to be in the Patronage of the Patron of the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity; and any residue after the provision of a site for and the erection and endowment of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London.

"(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United

Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, as aforesaid.

"10. That upon the union taking effect a part of the property and endowment of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be united, that is to say (a) a part, namely £295 per annum, of the stipend of £375 per annum at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, (b) a capital sum of £9 13s. 11d. now held by us on behalf of the same Benefice and (c) a sum of £43 10s. 5d. Four pounds per centum per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners on behalf of the same Benefice shall be excepted out of the union and shall be held and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the endowment of the proposed new Church and District hereinbefore referred to, and pending the formation of such District the income arising in respect thereof shall be accumulated in our hands for the same object.

"11. That with the consents of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (testified as aforesaid), as Patron of the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint John the Evangelist, and of the Reverend Noel Beddome Page, Incumbent of such Benefice (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that portion of the Parish of the said Benefice of Grays Inn Road, Holy Trinity, lying to the south of the middle of Theobald's Road shall be transferred and annexed to and form part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Holborn, Saint John the Evangelist, for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices

Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Ramsey, Saint Mary, situate in the County of Huntingdon, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Pond's Bridge, Saint Thomas, situate partly in the said County of Huntingdon and partly in the County of Cambridge, and both in the Diocese of Ely:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ramsey, Saint Mary, and Pond's Bridge, Saint Thomas, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ramsey, Saint Mary, and Pond's Bridge, Saint Thomas, are now full, the Reverend John Laurie Cooper being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ramsey, Saint Mary, and the Reverend James Price Stephens being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Pond's Bridge, Saint Thomas:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Southport, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of All Saints, Southport, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Southport, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Souls, Southport, situate as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop, with the consents of the Reverend Walter Edmund Harston Morris, of All Saints Vicarage, Southport, Clerk in Holy Orders, and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool, Leonard Davies Ireland, of Number 61, Albert Road, Southport, Esquire, Harold Tindall, of Number 10, Marsden Road, Southport, Esquire, John James Cockshott, of Number 31, Queen's Road, Southport, Esquire, John Eddowes Willett, of Number 3, Park Road, Southport, Esquire, and Abel Shaw, of Number 153, Sussex Road, Southport, Esquire, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of All Saints, Southport, and with the consent of the Reverend Duncan Gordon Macpherson, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Southport, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Vicar or Incumbent, the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Southport (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Southport, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Southport, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Souls, Southport, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of All Souls, Southport.’

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of All Souls, Southport, comprising:—

“1. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of All Saints, Southport, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the west partly by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Southport, partly by the New Parish of Saint Philip, Southport, partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Southport, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Birkdale, upon the south west by the Parish of Halsall, upon the

And whereas by section 4 (4) of the London Government Act, 1899, it was enacted that any of the adoptive Acts might be adopted in a Metropolitan Borough in like manner as in a Borough outside London, and not otherwise, and where any of the adoptive Acts adopted before the appointed day did not extend to the whole Borough, the Act might be adopted in the rest of the Borough in like manner as if it were a separate Borough and the Borough Council were the Council thereof:

And whereas the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1885, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, have been adopted, and are in force in the Parishes of St. Mary, Newington, and St. Saviour, Southwark, but not in the Parishes of St. George the Martyr and Christchurch, Southwark:

And whereas the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Southwark have presented a Petition to His Majesty stating that Orders in Council have been made for closing the burial-grounds of the Parishes situate within the said Metropolitan Borough, and representing that there is difficulty and inconvenience in providing, under the powers of the Burial Act, 1853, requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of certain of the parishes within the said Metropolitan Borough; and praying that powers might be vested in the Council of the said Metropolitan Borough of Southwark, for providing places of burial for the inhabitants of the said Parishes, pursuant to the provisions of the Burial Act, 1854, and any Acts amending or extending the same:

And whereas notice of such Petition and of the time when His Majesty was pleased to order that the same be taken into consideration by His Privy Council has been duly published as required by the above said first recited Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that powers be vested in the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Southwark, for providing requisite places of burial for the inhabitants of the Parishes of St. George the Martyr and Christchurch, within the said Metropolitan Borough of Southwark, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1854.
