RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT,
1924.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH MARCH, 1931.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 6).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling
him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this
Order is hereby declared to be a Foot-and-
Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes
of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected
Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-
MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF
1931 (No. 6) and shall be read with the Order
referred to in Article 1.

In the county of Stafford.

Stafford, Eccleshall, Stone, Cheadle (*except the
parishes of Consall, Kingsley, Oakmoor,
Farley, Cotton and Caudon*), Uttoxeter
(*except the parishes of Denstone, Prestwood,
Ellastone, Calwich, Mayfield, Okeover,
Stanton, Wootton and Ramshorn*) and
Rugeley; and the detached part of the petty
sessional division of Lichfield and Brownhills;

The parishes of Hanbury, Yoxall, Farewell
and Chorley, Burntwood, Wall, Ogle Hay,
Hammerwich, Ogle Hay Rural, Shire Oak,
Walsall Wood, Pelsall, Rushall, Essington,
Short Heath, Bentley, Wednesfield, Bushbury,
Codsall, Maer, Chapel and Hill Chorlton,
Clayton, Trentham, Whitmore, Madeley, Keele,
Silverdale, Chesterton, Wolstanton, Norton in
the Moors, Bagnall, Caverswall, Willenhall,
and Tettenhall; the parish of Muckleston
(*except such part as lies to the north west of
the boundary formed by the River Tern in its
course from the county boundary near Bear-
stone Mill Dam to Dorrington Bogs*); the
detached parts of the parishes of Tutbury,
