

BIRKENHEAD.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Birkenhead (hereinafter called the Corporation) being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Birkenhead Corporation Water Act, 1907, and the Birkenhead Corporation Act, 1923, so as:—

(1) To enable the Corporation and the Rural District Council of Holywell to agree upon an increased price for a supply of water in bulk by the Corporation to the Rural District Council in excess of one million gallons per quarter under an agreement dated the 5th day of April, 1907;

(2) For the purpose of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on that purpose to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said Borough as may be necessary or desirable.

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application:

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Health will consider any objections or representations made in writing before the second day of April, 1931, by any person or body interested in the subject matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order. BRISTOL.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the City of Bristol (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Section 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Clifton and Durham Downs (Bristol) Act, 1861, so as:—

(1) To authorise the provision, erection and maintenance of a building or buildings to afford changing and dressing room accommodation (with all necessary sanitary con-

veniences and facilities for washing) on a piece of land having an area of 600 square yards or thereabouts forming part of Durham Down and situate on the north-west side of the Bristol Waterworks Company's reservoir on the said Down;

(2) To empower the Corporation with the consent of the Minister of Health, to borrow money for the purpose aforesaid;

(3) For the purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said City as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

And whereas the Corporation have also applied to the Minister of Health for sanction to borrow £12,270 for the purchase of land and the buildings thereon at Greenbank (including Packer's Sports Ground) for purposes of cricket, football and other games and recreations and for other purposes not yet decided upon:

Notice is hereby given that C. B. Connell, Esq., M.Inst.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Council House, Bristol, on Thursday, the second day of April, 1931, at a quarter past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Applications and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Applications and the proposed Provisional Order, and that a plan showing the situation of the piece of land referred to in paragraph (1) may be inspected at the office of the Town Clerk, the Council House, Bristol, on any week-day prior to the said date during ordinary office hours.
